Offtrack paves artistic way in community

Hand-painted Oriental slippers bright with orchid flowers. Artist-designed stoneware incorporating decoration of sgraffito. Hand-made paper wall-hangings. Pressed cypress in porcelain. Scherenschnitt.

Scherenschnitt? Indeed, scherenschnitt, the traditional but nearly extinct and definitely obscure German folk art of scissor cutting.

This is just one reason that the Offtrack Gallery in Escondido is really off the beaten track.

Another is the gallery's location — downtown in Escondido's turn-of-the-century train station, a red and white celebration of Victorian wedding cake architecture, Southern California style. The station was moved off the side of the railroad tracks about a decade ago and now sits besides old Highway 161. For a while, it housed a hobby shop, but about three years ago, the building was purchased by Patskin coffee house operator Bob Sinclair, slightly remodelled and turned into a gallery space and indoor-outdoor setting for cappuccinos and croissants.

Offtrack chugged into the space, heading north from Del Mar where the same group of North County artists had collectively shown their work as Art Garden in the crowded Bradford Square.

Sunday (June 2) the gallery will observe its third anniversary in Escondido with an outdoor group sculpture event and by opening the third annual collaborative art show, "Point Counterpoint," that runs through June 30. Each of the nine artists and craftsmen in the show collaborated with a fellow gallery member on several pieces of team art.

The Sunday sculpture event from noon to 3 p.m. will feature the artists participating with the community to create a large skeletal network of rods made of tightly twisted newspapers.

"The main thing we have always wanted the gallery to be known for is community contact with the artists," says Georgia Larr, one of Offtrack's charter members. "Sharing information about what we are doing and not being selfish about techniques is really what we're interested in. We like being in the old train station because it lends itself to discussion groups. Having a nice place to share art together and relax becomes especially important when working like we are in a cooperative situation."

Larr — who has a Master's degree in painting and teaches at Mesa College (most of Offtrack's member artists teach art in area schools and universities) — hand paints on silk fabric and makes fiber jewelry. Her silk fabric painting is usually incorporated into wearable or accessory art such as scarves, hats and belts — many in an Oriental motif. She also currently shows a series of hand-painted Oriental or tai shoes at the gallery.

But the most offtrack of Offtrack's art and crafts work is the scherenschnitt of Britta Kling. A native of Germany, Kling creates and cuts designs from long fiber, cotton paper and mounts them on rag board. The designs — flowers, birds, fish and occasionally a mysterious old German castle or two — are then mounted in frames behind glass as wall-hangings.

Kling started scissor cutting as a childhood hobby. She has been cutting professionally for 25 years.

"Nobody in this country is hardly aware of the art," she says, "but it has started to make a little come-

back in Europe. It's very traditional German folk art. In fact, I have heard of artists that are so traditional still in Germany that all they do is copy over and over the patterns from the 18th century. But I enjoy making my own designs, especially of wildflowers that I sketch in the Sierras and love very much."

Another artist who started her work in Europe and exhibits at Offtrack is Anki Vindberg, a weaver from Sweden. Moving here from Stockholm, Vindberg quickly became acquainted with the North County art scene and met Devon Turak, a ceramicist who already was a member of the gallery. One of the gallery weavers happened to be leaving the cooperative around that time, Vindberg recalls, "so they were looking to hire a new person. I applied and was accepted. The gallery really feels like part of my family now."

Periodically, members of the cooperative come and go, moving to different places or to pursue new interests. Several of the current members, including photographer Will Gibson, are planning moves shortly. To keep the membership stable at around ten artists, the gallery is holding a jury for new partners at its monthly meeting Thursday. Anyone interested in joining should submit examples of their work by 4 p.m. that day.

In jurying for membership, says Larr, the cooperative looks at the quality of the work and the personality of the person coming in — is he or she responsible and interested in taking control of their careers?

"The remarkable thing so far

about the cooperative," she explains, "is that we always seem to be able to keep responsible persons who can rely on each other. Our attitudes go beyond hand-building. We want everybody to have respect for the community of each artist, but have a lot of room, too, for experimentation in how we run the business and hang the shows."

Offtrack also is unusual in that cooperative members run the entire show — from getting mailing lists together, to hanging exhibitions, to sitting the gallery during its regular hours, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily and weekends, except Mondays. Each member gets a turn at gallery sitting about three times a month.

"This helps give visitors a feeling that artists are real people," says Dana Reichman, a baker involved with the group. Reichman also warms kilns on fabrics and paper. Her favorite subjects are those of the sea. The gallery features works by two potters, Tranz and Nancy Gordon, each working in very different styles. Tranz, an instructor in contemporary crafts at UCSD, makes functional stoneware such as plates and bowls in earthy blue and brown tones with ornamental sgraffito designs.

Gordon's work, in contrast, is more sculptural and explores new shapes and forms in porcelain. She combines throws and hand-built forms in vases, cups and bowls, sometimes incorporating dried seaweed in the latter. Another example of Gordon's interest in altering forms is found in a series of pressed cypress in porcelain that are designed as large jewelry pieces.

Other artists whose work is featured are Nancy Rapp (Oriental brush painting), Gibson (photography), Mark Vranesh (baskets, etching and watercolors) and Lucie Millard-Barckley (papermaking).

Millard-Barckley has been associated with the cooperative for about 18 years, growing through a variety of mediums including textiles, batik and silk screen. Her current fascination is hand-made paper items that may be either decorative, as in wall-hangings, or functional, as in fans. A cooperative situation such as Offtrack, she believes, "allows artists to do much more experimental art work and with a small group like this we can easily exchange thoughts without getting involved in the monetary attitudes of a regular gallery."

"We don't have a get-rich scheme. Although North County is known to be wealthy, we know that not everybody here is able to collect \$2,000 paintings. The idea is to keep prices reasonable."

The most expensive pieces at Offtrack are in the neighborhood of \$100. The majority are in the \$50 range.
