

Gallery Hopping on the Coast

The gallery scene in Leucadia is really on the upswing. Within about six blocks you can see a variety of artwork produced mainly by local artists in at least five galleries. A tour of galleries on North Highway 101 is a delightful way to spend the afternoon.

You can enjoy a leisurely cup of coffee at Pannakin, and then walk down the stairs to the Off Track Gallery, a cooperative effort of nine (at this moment) artists who share the expenses and duties of running a gallery. According to Scherenschmitt (scissor cutting) folk artist Britta Kling, the gallery is always open to new artists.

The beauty of the Off Track Gallery is that you have the opportunity to view all nine artists work simultaneously, even though one is featured at a time. During my visit, I spent a great deal of time admiring the work of Britta Kling, the longest standing member of the coop. Her work is a traditional, but nearly extinct, German folk art wherein designs are cut from cotton paper and mounted on ragboard. She never uses a pattern and each piece is cut only once.

During the month of March, the Off Track will feature the very loose, nearing abstract watercolors of Clara Fleming. Fleming specializes in animals and her delicate, colorful work is frequently developed from monprints which provide the background and texture for her creatures.

Her menagerie includes long-nosed elephants with

shades of blue, an orange-beaked bird, multi-colored fish, attentive ground hogs, an elegant crane and even walrus, to name a few.

Just up the street you can stop in at Gallery 101 or the San Diego Art Guild for a look at what contemporary artists in the North County area are doing. Of course The Fig Leaf, which we discussed last month, is bringing much interest in art to Leucadia with its focus on nudes.

Another unique gallery is one of the two photographic shops in the entire county, Seewald's Photographic Art Gallery. The month of March brings photographer Louise Palazola whose colorful combinations of objects and paints are exciting and unique. Her skill in arranging her subject matter is as strong as her

abilities in recreating it photographically.

Seewald's also embarks on its first oil painting exhibition ever. A body of work produced by prolific (8 one-person shows, 60 two-person shows) Joyce Schleinger. Schleinger portrays women as headless, showing them to be more emotional than intellectual beings. Her works also impart a number of sexual overtones stemming from the style in which she paints her characters.

Whatever your taste in fine art, you will enjoy the best of local and regional talents along the coast. The coast has always fostered the expression of artistic talent, now these talented people have a number of places from which to show their works and share them with the public.

Gallery Hopping on the Coast

The gallery scene in Leucadia is really on the up-swing. Within about six blocks you can see a variety of artwork produced mainly by local artists in at least five galleries. A tour of galleries on North Highway 101 is a delightful way to spend the afternoon.

You can enjoy a leisurely cup of coffee at Pannakin, and then walk down the stairs to the Off Track Gallery, a cooperative effort of nine (at this moment) artists who share the expenses and duties of running a gallery. According to Scherenschnitte (scissor cutting) folk artists Britta Kling, the gallery is always open to new artists.
