



Nestled amid a grove of tall eucalyptus trees in Leucadia is a one of a kind house designed by a one of a kind lady — Greta Grossman.

After a varied career of architecture and designing furniture, jewelry and metal works — lamps and more — Greta is now enjoying a less strenuous career in painting, primarily in oils, but also experimenting in other media at the same time.

Grossman is surrounded by a setting of her own making — paintings, furniture and cabinets — that reflect the very interesting and total-absorbing life she has led. Her house is designed around simplicity. Walls are created by free standing cabinets

throughout. The kitchen is a marvel of efficiency, with no wasted space. The open feeling created by floor to ceiling windows throughout lets in the beautiful outdoor setting the trees and the numerous plants create. Paths meander here and yonder under the trees, giving the stroller a sense of peace hard to find in this day and age.

Grossman is a graduate of a college in Halsingborg, Sweden and the Institute of Industrial Design in Stockholm, plus one year at the Institute of Architecture and Design Studio in Stockholm. Among the numerous and prestigious awards she has won are a second prize in furniture design by the Arts and Crafts Guild of Sweden. She was the first

woman to be so honored in the more than 200-year history of the guild. Grossman also earned a honorable mention in silver design at a Paris International Jewelry Design exhibit; a "good design" award for a metal lamp design in a competition by the Museum of Modern Art in New York; a "good design" by the same museum for furniture design; and a citation award by the American Hardwood Association, Chicago for furniture designs.

She's worked in a design studio in Beverly Hills and has worked on industrial and residential projects in the Los Angeles, numerous homes in California's upper and lower desert areas, and homes in Northern Sweden that have been featured in "Arts & Ar-

chitecture," "Progressive Architecture," "Interiors," "House & Gardens" and other magazines, both in America and abroad.

When Greta decided to add painting to her considerable talents, she studied in adult classes at San Dieguito High School, the College of the Desert and with our own North County watercolor teacher, Thelma S. Houston.

Grossman will be displaying her works at the San Dieguito Art Guild's gallery this month. This is a special show in her honor which is made possible by guild president Elsie Goss, who has donated her studio space.
