At this point, she wishes to address a concern vis a vis the comparative size between our present location and that of our possible future one at Bradford Gallery. Based on rough calculations, Bradford Gallery will accommodate 27 wall renters with 6 linear feet of wall space each. Factored into the decision to standardize rental space in 6 foot increments is a plan for painting rotation in an effort to keep the Gallery fresh and inviting. Overall wall rental space can be increased with partitioning. At Bradford Gallery we will gain approximately 4 additional linear feet of Artist of the Fionth hanging space compared to what we now have and also 4 extra linear feet for our monthly art shows. Again, partitioning would increase hanging space in these areas.
