MEMBERSHIP OBLIGATIONS

FINANCIAL:

3. The acquisition of a **resale license** is required in order to become a **Wall Renter**. (Board of Equalization:744-1330)
4. Members are required to pay **15% commission** to the Guild on all paintings sold **from the monthly show wall**, and on **shrink wraps** sold from the bin.
5. **Wall Renter Members** are required to pay **quarterly wall dues**. Current dues are \$50 quarterly for a half wall or \$100 quarterly for a full wall.

PHYSICAL:

1. Each member has the responsibility to **attend an orientation session** before their first day of gallery sitting. (call Betty Sturdevan at 753-7403 for times)
2. Each member has the responsibility of **sitting one-half day a month** if entering a painting into the monthly show, **or one full day a month** if they are a Wall Renter.
3. Wall Renters must keep their wall space current, and be at the gallery on wall rotation day which occurs once every three months.(or make special arrangements with Joan Grine at 481-8783)
4. Members with a file must make periodic checks of their file.
5. Every member **must read** our **Procedural Manual** and familiarize themselves with our gallery system and sales procedures. (failure to do this can cause lost income and sales to our members)

PENALTIES:

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Original work only. Not acceptable are copied or class work and previous SDAG art show winners. Oils must be dry; all paintings must be framed, multistrand wired 2" to 3" from top so that painting hangs flat against the wall. The Arts Committee has the right to refuse any entry that fails to meet these standards.

Limit of two paintings per entrant; maximum size 48" in any direction including frame.

New and Separate Category: 3-DIMENSIONAL ART: 3-dimensional pieces will be in a separate category rather than the "Other" category. Monthly shows having a minimum of three pieces of 3-D work entered, by 3 different artists, will be judged and awarded one ribbon. Members who create 3-dimensional art are encouraged to enter monthly shows.
