Wall Renters:

FULL-wall renters are asked to bring 5-6 paintings; HALF-wall renters, 2-3 paintings.

Because of space configuration, Wall Renters will no longer hang their own walls but rather a Hanging Committee is being formed for this purpose. However, all paintings by a single artist will be displayed on the same wall (e.g., West wall) but will be mixed and matched with other artists' work on the same wall. Wall Renters:

FULL-wall renters are asked to bring 5-6 paintings; HALF-wall renters, 2-3 paintings.

Because of space configuration, Wall Renters will no longer hang their own walls but rather a Hanging Committee is being formed for this purpose. However, all paintings by a single artist will be displayed on the same wall (e.g., West wall) but will be mixed and matched with other artists' work on the same wall. The Hanging Committee has the right to not hang a painting because of size, offensive subject matter, framing, crowding, etc. Everything possible will be done to hang all paintings received. Any paintings not hung will be stored with cardboard in between them for pick-up by the artist on sitting day.

Wall Renters' Space will be rotated every two month. Because all wall renters are paid through September, current wall renters are asked to pay only for October at take-in time on September 4. Fees are: \$33.00 for a full-wall; \$16.50 for a half-wall. According to the up-to-date list, wall renters are:

Artist-of-the-Month Show will be on the back North wall.

Gallery Hours: The Gallery will be open seven days a week from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. This change is being made because of the amount of foot traffic on the premises.

Bradford Gallery location: In addition to opening the new Gallery in September, we would like to keep the old Gallery open through friday. September 23. Our lease runs until the end of September. We encourage all wall renters to leave some paintings on their walls through September 23. If you entered August's Monthly Show, you may leave your work in until September 23. Any member not currently showing but who wishes to hang one or more paintings, at a total cost of \$5.00, may do so by bringing in work on Sunday, September 4, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Pearl Cadvell and Betty Sturdevan will be there to nelp find a hanging area. Anyone showing work in this gallery during September MUST sign up for a half-day of sitting. We must fill the calendar from September 1 through September 23 if the gallery is to remain open.

Removal of Art Work from the Bradford Gallery: All work must be removed from the Bradford location on Saturday, September 24 and Sunday, September 25. This will give us one week to leave the premises in order.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Original work only. Not acceptable are copied or class work and previous SDAG art show winners. Oils must be dry; all paintings must be framed, multistrand wired 2" to 3" from top so that painting hangs flat against the wall. The Arts Committee has the right to refuse any entry that fails to meet these standards.

The number of awards presented is determined by the number of entries received in each category. 3-dimensional work will be judged if a minimum of three pieces are entered by three different artists.

ENTRY FEES: 15.00 for one; \$8.00 for two. Entries 36" or over in any direction, including frame, \$7.00 for each entry.
