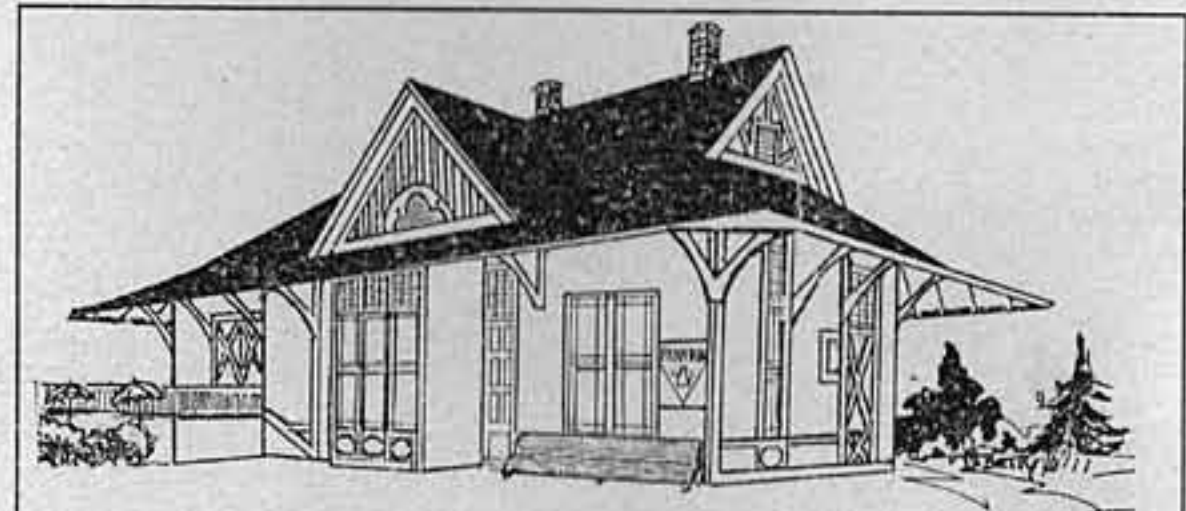

5. Wall Renter members are required to pay bi-monthly wall dues. Current dues are \$16.50 for a half wall and \$33.00 for a full wall per month.

### **PHYSICAL:**

1. Each member has the responsibility to attend an orientation session before their first day of gallery sitting (call Betty Sturdevan: 753-7403).
2. All Wall Renters must sit one full day per month. Members entering the Monthly Show must sign up to perform specific jobs in lieu of sitting the gallery. This will be done when they enter the show.
3. Wall Renters must rotate their exhibit every two months on Wall Rotation Day.
4. Members with files must check them periodically.
5. Every member sitting the gallery must read the Procedural Manual and familiarize themselves with the gallery system and sales procedures.
