



art, art will be available. We all can and should own art. Even the practising and professional artist. To collect art is to grace our lives with the beauty and excitement and energy that only an original creation can offer! In a materialistic society, we strive for the means to acquire possessions that will enrich our lives. Art is the true luxury that makes our lives more significant.

The Art Collector receives many rewards. The sharing in the creative process, the sense of empowerment at acquiring an art work, the sense of excitement that comes from supporting an artist in whose work we take pleasure and the sense of expectancy that the acquired art may one day increase in value as the artist continues, aided by our support and confidence giving reassurance. A guide for the Art Collector would look something like a question and answer sheet, question;

- Why should I own an original art work?
 Because it contains an energy that will enrich and empower.
- 2. How can I acquire Art which I know to be of value?

The value <u>must be</u> inherent in the excitement it creates, the sense of a new discovery and in the awe and wonder with which it imbues.

- 3. What about the fact that it is more expensive to own an original than a reproduction? In the long run the price one pays for an original work of art amortizes over the period of a life time and accelerates if it is engendered to the individual's estate, becoming a family heirloom.
- 4. How do I begin to Collect Art?

Building an Art Collection is like acquiring a wardrobe.

Begin with the purchase of an artist's work which pleases you for any reason. Evaluate and determine if the Art expresses something unspoken that reflects your own individuality.



5. How do I build on my Art Collection?

The best Interior Designer can put the right accessories and furniture together to create an environment. The Art is the main ingredient that will complete the creation of your own individual statement.

6. What is the function of an Art Gallery in the creation of my Art Collection?

Art Galleries make the work of talented artists available and should control the value of the works by artists they represent. The Art Gallery develops the relationship between the Artist and the Art Collector and can insure the increase of the value of the art.

7. How can I overcome the increased expense of purchasing art from an Art Gallery?

The Art Gallery, as the Artist's direct representative, should make payment arrangements available that are suitable for the individual's economic situation. These payment arrangements should be affordable and convenient and there is never a reason why any interest should be charged. As an Art Collector, you will be living with the art for a long time, what is the rush to pay for it? A monthly amount, generously apportioned to the artist to keep the artist creating, could make everyone happy. Be of good Cheer this holiday season and give yourself the gift that enriches for a lifetime, that empowers you to strive toward an even greater appreciation of the "good" things in life. Practise the art of collecting

art!
