



WALL/FLOOR RENTALS (The information in the following three paragraphs is provided courtesy of Jackie Bissel and Judianne Shannon): As you probably already know, SDAG has approximately 30 - 35 Wall/Floor Renters at any given time. Wall/Floor Renters are SDAG members who sign up for rental space in the gallery (there is usually a waiting list, which is operated on a first come, first served basis) and are subsequently juried in by the Wall/Floor Renter Committee. Wall renters may rent either a Half-Wall Space (approximately 48 x 60") for \$50.00/3months, or a Whole Wall Space (approximately 96 x 120") for \$100.00/3months. SDAG Wall/Floor Renters are responsible for sitting the Off Track Gallery and each renter must sit one whole day (or two half days) per month. After a wall/floor renter signs up for a particular sitting time, he/she must sit the gallery at the assigned time, or pay a qualified sitter to sit for them, or exchange with a qualified sitter. The only people who are exempt from the sitting requirement are the President and the Gallery Manager. All new Wall/Floor Renters must make an appointment with Betty Sturdevan (Gallery Manager) for orientation and training prior to sitting the gallery for the first time.

<u>WALL/FLOOR RENTERS</u> are broken up into <u>eight</u> separate groups, which are identified alphabetically as groups <u>A through H</u>. A new renter is assigned to a specific group based on which space has been vacated prior to his/her acceptance. That is, if an existing renter comes off the wall who belongs to group B, then whoever replaces that wall renter will automatically be assigned to the vacated space in group B. (If the exiting renter is in group F, then the new renter will be assigned to the vacated space in group F, etc.) <u>Wall Locations</u> are numbered <u>1 - 8</u> and are located in the Gallery as follows:



At each Wall/Floor Rotation (every 3 months) each group (A through H) rotates to the next numerical wall location in the sequence (1 - 8). That is, if group A is hanging at Wall Location #5, it will move to Wall Location # 6 at the next rotation. If group A is currently hanging at Wall Location #8, it will move to location #1 at the next rotation, etc.

In addition to the general rotation procedure mentioned above, there are also <u>artistic</u> <u>considerations</u> and <u>space considerations</u> that must be taken into account at the time the show is being hung.
