# SDAG FRAMING AND EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS:

Maximum size for entries must not exceed 48 inches in height or width, including the frame. Original work only. Copies of existing artwork, class work, or previous winning art show entries are not allowed in this competition. And, in general, artists should not enter any work that is more than two years old or has been previously entered in any SDAG Monthly/Specialty Show (this is a new rule). All paintings must be framed with the exception of an oil or acrylic done on canvas, which wraps around the stretcher bars and is stapled on the back. All works must have multistrand wire, which when hung is slack enough to come 2-3 inches from the top of the painting. Plexiglass should be used in lieu of glass for framed works 22 x 24 inches, or larger (not including frame). Works done in pastel are exempted from the plexiglass requirement due to problems with static electricity. Artists must include 1) Artist's Name, 2) Title of Work, 3) Medium used, and 4) Price, on the back of each entry. Entry fees for the February Cash Awards Show are \$10.00 per entry for work under 36 inches in height or width, and \$18.00 for entries 36 inches and larger (dimensions include the frame). Note: The Art Committee has the right to refuse any entry not conforming to these standards.

The fee for

# SDAG FRAMING AND EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS

Maximum size for entries must not exceed 48 inches in height or width, including the frame. Original work only. Copies of existing artwork and class work are not allowed in this competition. And, in general, artists should not enter any work that is more than two years old or has been previously entered in any SDAG Monthly/Specialty Show (this is a new rule). All paintings must be framed with the exception of an oil or acrylic done on canvas, which wraps around the stretcher bars and is stapled on the back. All works must have multistrand wire, which when hung is slack enough to come 2-3 inches from the top of the painting. Plexiglass should be used in lieu of glass for framed works 22 X 24 inches, or larger (not including frame). Works done in pastel are exempted from the plexiglass requirement due to problems with static electricity. Artists must include 1) Artist's Name, 2) Title of Work, 3) Medium used, and 4) Price, on the back of each entry. Entry fees for the Monthly Shows are \$7.00 per entry for work under 36 inches in height or width, and \$15.00 for entries 36 inches and larger (dimensions include the frame). Note: The Art Committee has the right to refuse any entry not conforming to these standards.

<u>CARD RACKS</u>: If you go to the card racks and find that your position has changed, please refer to the Procedure Book (on the desk) to locate your current position. Thanks.

## SDAG FRAMING AND EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS

Maximum size for entries must not exceed 48 inches in height or width, including the frame. Original work only. Copies of existing artwork and class work are not allowed in this competition. And, in general, artists should not enter any work that is more than two years old or has been previously entered in any SDAG Monthly/Specialty Show (this is a new rule). All paintings must be framed with the exception of an oil or acrylic done on canvas, which wraps around the stretcher bars and is stapled on the back. All works must have multistrand wire, which when hung is slack enough to come 2-3 inches from the top of the painting. Plexiglass should be used in lieu of glass for framed works 22 x 24 inches, or larger (not including frame). Works done in pastel are exempted from the plexiglass rquirement due to problems with static electricity. Artists must include 1) Artist's Name, 2) Title of Work, 3) Medium used, and 4) Price, on the back of each entry. Entry fees for the Monthly Shows are \$7.00 per entry for work under 36 inches in height or width, and \$15.00 for entries 36 inches and larger (dimensions include the frame). Note: The Art Committee has the right to refuse any entry not conforming to these standards.







# ARTIST OF THE MONTH: MICHAEL SEEWALD

Michael's photographic career spans more than 30 years and includes a B.A. in photojournalism from San Diego State University as well as many years of free-lance photography. He has won awards in dozens of national and international competitions, including "Best of Show" at the International Photographic Competition at the Del Mar Fair, the San Diego Museum of Photographic Art, the San Dieguito Art Guild, and the San Diego Art Institute. The Los Angeles Museum of Contemporary Art's curator judged one of his photographs as one of the "top 100 in the world" from a field of over 3,300 entries. Currently he divides his time between photographic field work, gathering images from around the world; preparing and teaching photographic workshops; and giving lectures on photographic technique and the artist's perspective.
