# NOTE FROM SHIRLEY HAWLEY-PRESIDENT SDAG

The SDAG Board of Directors has decided, after careful study and discussion, to raise the wall/floor rent and monthly show fees. These increases will help offset rising costs for building rents and bookkeeping. The Guild cannot continue to operate with a negative cash balance as we have for several months. The half wall/floor rental fee will increase from \$40 to \$60 per quarter, which represents an additional \$3.00 per month. The full wall/floor rental fee will increase from \$100 to \$120 per quarter, or an additional amount of \$6.66 per month. Monthly show fees will increase from \$7 to \$10 per entry. Over-sized paintings will continue to be \$15 per entry. These increases will be effective with April's rotation and monthly show.

Beginning with April's rotation and April's monthly show, our bookkeepers will institute a new payment

system. They will issue checks for artists' monthly sales totaling \$25 or more, with no check writing fees. Artists with sales between \$10 and \$25 will be paid at the end of each quarter. The MotherLode Bookkeeping Service in Encinitas estimates this bookkeeping system will cost SDAG \$5 per check. This service includes wiring checks, reconciling bank statements, and issuing financial statements. They also quoted us a fee of \$250 for filing our taxes at year end, or half the amount we paid for last year's filing.

The members of SDAG enjoy a great gallery in a fantastic location. Accordingly, our rent will continue to increase each year, along with gallery operating costs. Our artists' rents are low when compared with rents at other galleries in North San Diego County. The Board is committed to keeping fees as low as possible for its members. Thank you for you continued support.



But, we still need to make sure the guild's A-Frames are available on-site. If you have a truck and can help deliver and return the A-Frames please let lanet or Lisa Jackson know you are volunteering. On this day, Quail Gardens will have a High Tea in their Walled Garden. It is in addition to the \$12.00 Ticket price for the two day weekend. Call Quail Gardens at 760-436-3036 for your reservations for the tea. Quail Gardens will also have music, food, tours of the gardens, and children's fun activities. On Sunday, it is show time for us. Ten of our members and other North County artists are opening their studio's and garden's for the Mother's Day for a self guided tour of the Del Mar, Rancho Santa Fe, Encinitas, and La Costa areas. Some of the local garden centers and plant societies are setting up displays at the artist's homes and answering garden design and flora related questions. Each artist will have at least two docents to help out( make sure no one falls in the ponds, eats the paint, help get addresses, make sales of tickets and art work, etc.). As you read, our rents will be \$120.00 per quarter for a full space and \$60.00 per quarter for a half space starting with the next rotation in April. This is still a bargain for the busiest little gallery in the west.

On Monday we had an unloading zone at the south end of the building. Then the process starts outdoors with a celendar sign-up. Once that is complete, you carry your new paintings downstaris with the helper. Unfortunately only two or three members used our unloading zone which caused the outdoor helpers to disappear from boredom. Once downstairs fees are paid, cards made and placed on paintings, and paintings taken to their new wall. It would be helpful if arcists made cards at home and attached them to the paintings before coming. As you sit the gallery in March please take some of these cards home and use them for our next rotation. The cards will be kept in a hox in the bottom of the file case to the right of the desk. -Pat Watkins
