Ten of our members and other North County artists are opening their studios and gardens for the Mother's Day for a self guided tour of the Del Mar, Rancho Santa Fe, Encinitas, and La Costa areas. Come of the local garden centers and plant societies are setting up displays at the artist's homes and answering garden design and flora related questions. Each artist will have a least two docents to help out (make sure no one falls in the ponds, eats the paint, help get addresses, make sales of tickets and art work, etc.). Tickets will be available on April 1st. If you can't help or participate, please buy a ticket and be one of the 400-600+ tourist (we've had that many attend!). You will want to be part of this event. The Guild and Gallery have developed a wonderful following and have received a lot of great press for this event. ### Wall/floor Renters and Other Guild Artists

Right now the Gallery is in an unusual situation with fewer Wall and Floor artists than we need. I know from past history, that during some years artists have had to languish on the waiting list for years before getting onto a wall. Indeed that was my situation many years ago. If you decide you would like to be a Wall or Floor Renter this is indeed a rare opportunity. Call Rae Colori today and she will update you on the requirements. As you read, our rents will be \$120.00 per quarter for a full space and \$60.00 per quarter for a half space starting with the next rotation in April. This is still a bargain for the busiest little gallery in the west.

Well the last Wall and Floor Renter's rotation went smoothly for most of our members. Having Floor Renters some in on Sunday afternoon and Wall Renters on Monday helped

thin out the crowd. On Monday we had an unloading zone at the south end of the building. The plan was to have you unload your paintings from your car with a helper, hurry downstairs with the helper to retrieve your old paintings, load them into your car and then re-park. Then the process starts outdoors with a calendar sign-up. Once that is complete, you carry your new paintings downstairs with the helper. Unfortunately only two or three members used our unloading zone which caused the outdoor helpers to disappear from boredom. Once downstairs fees are paid, cards made and placed on paintings, and paintings taken to their new wall. It would be helpful if artists made cards at home and attached them to the paintings before coming. As you sit the gallery in March please take some of these cards home and use them for our next rotation. The cards will be kept in a box in the bottom of the file case to the right of the desk.



#### WHAT IS A PRINT?

What determines a print as an original is an evolving definition as computers, copy machines, etc. change the process. An original print can be defined as a final piece of artwork made directly from a plate, stone, screen or block, before whose completion no finished artwork existed in any form. This means the majority of the artist's effort is spent developing the creative image directly on the plate, stone, screen, or block in order to produce a print which is, in itself, the original artwork. In most instances an edition is produced in which no two prints are ever exactly alike, but in which each is considered an original piece of artwork in its own right. Usually, the size of a given print edition is limited and the artist's signature and edition number appear on each original print. -provided in part by Ruth Dennis

#### WHAT IS A PRINT?

What determines a print as an original is an evolving definition as computers, copy machines, etc. change the process. A original print can be defined as a final piece of artwork made directly from a plate, stone, screen or block, before whose completion no finished artwork existed in any form. This means the majority of the artist's effort is spent developing the creative image directly on the plate, stone, screen, or block in order to produce a print which is, in itself, the original artwork. In most instances an edition is produces in which not two prints are ever exactly alike, but in which each is considered an original piece of artwork in its own right. Usually, the size of a given print edition is limited and the artist's signature and edition number appear on each original print. - provided in part by Ruth Dennis.
