



# July Demonstrators Greg Evans Cartoonist

Greg Evans is the creator of the nationally syndicated comic strip, LUANN, which appears in over 300 newspapers in the United States and abroad. Captivated by cartooning at an early age, he admits he was "Born with the 'toon disease". Raised in Burbank, home of Disney Studios, Greg dreamed of someday working for Walt, giving life to Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck. Even in elementary school, he entertained and amazed his classmates with accurate, spontaneous sketches of Disney characters. But then he discovered the newspaper comic page and decided he wanted to become a comic strip cartoonist. By the age of 12, he was creating his own comic strips. In 1970, he graduated from Cal State Northridge with a bachelor of arts degree. His major was art-not cartooning-but watercolor, printmaking and graphic design. Greg went on to get his teaching credential and secured his first classroom assignment at Central Union High School in El Centro, California, teaching art. He taught for four years, got married, traveled the world, lived in Australia for two years and returned to Colorado Springs where he landed a job as a graphic artist for a television station. Today, Greg lives and works at his home in San Marcos. A member of the San Diego Watercolor Society, he grabs his easel whenever he gets the chance and heads out to paint San Diego county. LUANN was born in March 1965. Ilis goal in LUANN is to touch reader's hearts as well as their funny bone-to enlighten as well as entertain-join Greg at the July General Meeting where he will delight us with his demonstration!

# August Demoistrator Bill Cignante -Courtroom Mustrator

As a child of five, Bill copied comic section characters from the Sunday papers. An artist was born and for 26-years Bill Lignante worked for ABC Network Television as their courtroom illustrator. Now retired and living in Carlsbad, his 50-year career as a creative artist has also included syndicated comic strips. In the 1960's courtroom illustrators were without job descriptions ( sounds just like any other artist!) . July Demonstrator: Greg Evans - Cartoonist


Greg Evans is the creator of the nationally syndicated comic strip, LUANN, which appears in over 300 newspapers in the United States and abroad. Captivated by cartooning at an early age, he admits he was "Born with the 'toon disease". Raised in Burbank, home of Disney Studios, Greg dreamed of someday working for Walt, giving life to Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck. Even in elementary school, he entertained and amazed his classmates with accurate, spontaneous sketches of Disney characters. But then he discovered the newspaper comic page and decided he wanted to become a comic strip cartoonist. By the age of 12, he was creating his own comic strips. In 1970, he graduated from Cal State Northridge with a bachelor of arts degree. His major was art - not cartooning - but watercolor, printmaking and graphic design. Greg went on to get this teaching credential and secured his first classroom assignment at Central Union High School in El Centro, California, teaching art. He taught for four years, got married, traveled the world, lived in Australia for two years and returned to Colorado Springs where he landed a job as a graphic artist for a television station. Today, Greg lives and works at his home in San Marcos. A member of the San Diego Watercolor Society, he grabs his easel whenever he gets the chance and heads out to paint San Diego County. LU-ANN was born in March 1985. 



1. Fees: \$10 for Artwork up to 36"; \$15 for Artwork 36"- 48"

2. A 15% commission will be taken for Monthly Show sales.

3. Maximum Size: 48" (any direction).

4. No glass in frames larger than 22' x 24" (Use Plexiglass or equivalent. Pastels excluded).

5. Paintings must be framed (oil or acrylic on wraparound canvas excepted).

6. Frames must have multi-strand wire for hanging,

2-3" from top at center. Please tape ends of wire.

7. All artwork must be original. No reproductions.

8. All Artwork must be For Sale.

9. Artwork should be less than two years old and not previously entered in a SDAG Monthly Show.

10. Artwork must be labeled (on back) with: Artist's name, Title, Category (see rule 11 below), Medium and Price. Please prepare two labels (available on the back page of the "Paint Rag").

11. Normal categories include: Oil & Acrylic, Water Media (includes acrylic under glass), Photography, Wood Block prints, etchings, and monoprints hand pulled by the artist, and Other Media. Any media with at least five entries will create an additional category. 12. It is up to the Artist to place their work in proper category. Incorrectly categorized work may be ineligible for judging.

13. The Art committee reserves the right to refuse any entry not conforming to rules and standards of the Guild.

If you have a question about these rules, call Isabella Breasted or Kim Treffinger prior to entry day for the correct answer to your question. Do not show up with improperly framed work on entry day hoping the rules will be bent for you - it will not happen.



#### Information/Changes For Wall Renters
