Olivia Priller

Olivia Angier Priller, age 87, died 21, 2004, in Encinitas, Calif. Born September 26, 1916, in Bozeman, Mont., Olivia lived in San Diego County for 54 years. She lived for many years in Cardiff-by-the-Sea and later in the community of Kensington in San Diego. She graduated from high school in Camden, Maine, in 1935 and studied art in Los Angeles. She married Joseph Jaques Walker in 1937; they had three children.

Olivia was an accomplished fine artist who enjoyed much recognition with her sculptures, batiks and collages. She was a founding member of the Carrousel Art Gallery of Encinitas, a successful woman-owned and operated cooperative, where she exhibited from the early '70s through the late '80s. Olivia#'s work was featured at the Sculptors Guild and Art Institute in Balboa Park and at many regional events in Southern California.

At the age of 56, Olivia met Harold John Priller. They married in 1976 and were active and loving grandparents to their many grandchildren. Eager to enjoy living, Harold and Olivia shared a passion for collecting bronzes, lalique and cloisonne; classical music; opera; films; and books.

Olivia was a former member of the Cardiff School Board and met regularly with friends who called themselves The Cardetts. Later in life when she could no longer sculpt because of arthritis, she took up writing her life stories. She wrote seven self-published volumes of memoirs.

Olivia is survived by two daughters, Jacqueline Webb Ingle of Encinitas and Jill Ellen Stephenson of Grass Valley, Calif.; one son Joel Chandler Walker of Cayucos, Calif. She is survived by three stepdaughters, 10 grand-children and 10 great-grandchildren.

A celebration of Olivia's life will be held on Friday, February 6 at Quail Gardens in Encinitas at 11 a.m. A private cremation and burial at sea near her much loved husband, Harold will be held.


January Artist of the Month Kirk Van Allyn

KIRKOS, Kirk's artistic alias, is a long-time Leucadia resident and committed community contributor not only at the artistic level where he has been acknowledged in articles and awards, but also at the crucial environmental level whereby "junk" is transformed into attractive and utilitarian tools for his tidal art.

The tidal or sand art for which Kirkos is best known, is dramatically executed at Beacons, Swamis, and Stone Step beaches in Encinitas. The forms he draws are geometric in nature, such as the ancient religious labyrinth design, originally a walking meditation. Kirkos draws, creating patterns of great scale and beauty utilizing the grand natural canvas of the ebb tide sand. Observers, especially children, are drawn into the center of this archetypical art. 
