

NEW - RULES FOR MONTHLY TAKE-IN

All work must be original work, not a reproduction, and must be for sale. All work should be less than two years old, and cannot have been in a previous SDAG show.

Please have your entry slip already filled out, except for the Item Number, which will be added at the check-in table. There will be one of these slips printed in your Paint Rag. You only need one.

Your work should have some identification on the back.

If there is a question about the Department Number, there is a list on the take-in table, or a volunteer can help you. Your entry must be in the correct department or it may be ineligible for judging.

Do not bring in wet paintings or frames. A 15% commission will be charged on sales from the Monthly Show.

Work must be framed unless you use the wraparound canvas stapled in the back.

The wire should be the multi-strand wire, attached approximately one fourth of the way down from the top of the frame, and slack enough to come up to approximately 2" from the top of the frame.

Please tape the ends of the wire, and please don't put tape or tubing in the middle of the wire. It will not fit our hangers if you do. Instead the Guild will offer its members many opportunities to display their art, including a showing at the Scripps La Jolla Hospital, BAE Systems in Rancho Bernardo and the extremely well attended and popular Mother's Day Home Tour held each May.

GALLERY MANAGER

1) JOB DESCRIPTION:

The gallery manager is responsible for the managing the smooth and efficient operation of the gallery. She/he oversees the staffing of the gallery, takes inventory and maintains supplies used in the gallery. She/he can call a Gallery Committee meetings when needed to address improvements, any expenditures over a \$100.00, or problems that need to be brought to the board for vote. Or she/he may bring anything up at the board without Gallery Committee input. The Gallery Manager interfaces with the other committee chairs and the Gallery Committee to find ways to make the gallery more viable, profitable and efficient. The Gallery Manager is required to attend monthly board meetings but can request their assistant to attend in their absence. If possible, the Gallery Manager is not required to do sitting duties.

2) STAFFING OF THE GALLERY:

- a.) The Gallery manager assigns or asks the nominating committee to find a person that will head Orientation & Training of new sitters. The Orientation Assistant will train new sitters how to use the computer as well as the responsibility of how to do sales, and any additional jobs that are required of renters. At the time of training, the Assistant will review how the sitting calendar works and any responsibilities they must fulfill. Training will be done in a special session before the new sitter needs to do their first sitting duty.
- b.) The Gallery manager will interface with the VP of Information's chair on the sitting calendars. The VP of Information's will have the calendar finalized one week before the next month and placed it on the duty desk. The VP of Information's will work with the next month's Calendar of the Month Chairperson to make sure all sitting slots are filled before the Master Calendar is printed and placed on the duty desk. The Gallery manager will be kept informed on the status of the calendar and will receive a copy by email when the final calendar is completed.
- c.) The Gallery Manager will be in communication with the Calendar of the Month Chair as needed to make sure things are being handled and the gallery is being staffed each day for both shifts. She/he will review the daily notes written by the sitters during the month to check for any problems or things to address or will be contacted by sitters if something needs to be handled.
- d.) The Gallery Manager has an assistant who can be called on to help with any of the operations of the gallery.

3) EFFICIENT OPERATIONS OF THE GALLERY

- a.) The Gallery Manager has additional assistants that chair different areas of operation:
- 1. CARD RACK MANAGER: The Card Rack Manager is responsible for signing up new card sellers and maintaining the clean and orderly display of the cards. The Gallery Manager can call on the Card Rack Manager to handle any problems in this area.
- 2. SHRINK WRAP MANAGER: The Shrink Wrap Manager is responsible for making sure that the shrink-wraps look clean and orderly. That manager is also responsible to make sure that members follow the procedures for the number of shrink-wraps displayed and that they are all properly bar coded.
- 3. BARCODERS/TRAINERS/POSSE HELPERS: The Gallery Manager has a team of helpers responsible to train any new renters as well has making sure that everything that's for sale in the gallery has a bar code and is in the computer inventory. The Gallery Manager maintains or asks a helper to make sure the Bar Code Notebook is in good working order.
- 4. WALL & FLOOR RENTERS CHAIR: The Gallery Manager will interface with the Wall & Floor Renters Chairpersons to make sure everything is running smoothly for the rotations and setting up of new renters with orientation and volunteer duties. The Gallery Manager will maintain good communications for future improvements and changes in the gallery with each of the Renter Chairs. The Gallery Manager can call on the Renter Chairs to handle any situations that need to be addressed in each of these areas.
- 5. MONTHLY SHOW CHAIR: The Gallery Manager will also interface with the Monthly Show Chair to make sure everything is running efficiently. Since the gallery is not able to store any art left from shows, the Gallery Manager will make sure that the Monthly Show Chairperson has made arrangements for artists to be called when art work is not picked on Take-in Day. (This is true of any rotation artwork also.)

- 6. DESK SITTERS: The Gallery Manager may request the Desk Sitter at anytime to help with any tasks that might be of help to the Gallery Manager. This could include taking inventory, doing specific cleaning; making phone calls, or anything else that might be of help to the manager. The Sitters are the eyes and ears for the Gallery Manager.
- 7. CLEANING & MAINTINACE CREW: The Gallery Manager has a Cleaning & Maintenance Crew that is assigned to help with the regular clean appearance and smooth workings of the gallery. They can be assigned to do special jobs or cleaning at anytime needed. Or the Gallery Manager can set up a regular schedule.

4) SPECIAL EVENTS:

- a.) If any special events involve the gallery its self, the Gallery Manager will interface with the Event Coordinator or event Chairperson to make sure that the event is 1.) Listed on the Gallery Calendar and there are no conflicts, 2.) That the Chair or Event Coordinator has handled all aspects involving the use of the gallery, 3.) And all aspects relating to the desk sitter are handled. This might include special instructions for sales or announcements that could be provided by the Event Coordinator or Chair.
- b.) The Gallery Manager can call on the Hospitality Chairperson when needed.

5) ADDITIONAL DUTIES:

- a.) The Gallery Manager will maintain the Gallery Notebooks or assign a helper to keep them up-to-date and in good working order. These include the "Daily Book", The POS Book, the BAR CODING Book, and the Procedures Book.
- b.) The Gallery Manager will maintain or find helpers to keep the storage areas in the gallery in order. And to maintain an inventory list for the storage unit as well as additional storage that other members have at their homes.
- c.) The Gallery Manager will request help in keeping forms up-to-date and adding any new forms deemed necessary to do her/his job.
