All work should be less than two years old, and cannot have been in the previous monthly SDAG show.

A 15% commission will be charged on sales from the Monthly Show.

Please have your entry slip (just one) already filled out, except for the Item Number, which will be added at the check-in table. There will be one of these slips printed in your Paint Rag.

Work must be framed unless you use the wrap-around canvas stapled in the back and should have some identification on the back.

If there is a question about the Department Number, there is a list on the take-in table, or a volunteer can help you. Your entry must be in the correct department or it may be ineligible for judging.

Do not bring in wet paintings or frames.

The wire should be the multi-strand wire, attached approximately one fourth of the way down from the top of the frame, and slack enough to come up to approximately 2" from the top of the frame.

Please tape the ends of the wire, and please don't put tape or tubing in the middle of the wire. It will not fit our hangers if you do.

If your work, including frame, measures less than 26" on the longest side, your fee is \$10. For work 26" and up to 32" (which is the maximum size that we can accept), the fee is \$15. *Measure carefully.* 

Be sure your work looks as nice as it can, with clean, well put-together frame, clean glass and a well-cut mat.

The Take-in committee reserves the right to refuse entries that do not meet gallery standards.



- They want to know what is going on!! They want to see a budget in the newsletter, particularly since the Board had some type of financial report from Peter Fay in July (or June). If nothing else, publish total monthly sales, starting with Feb. If a monthly sales total is difficult to compile, use a monthly check total as a substitute.
- Changes in the Monthly Show: These suggestions need a vote and a firm commitment of 6 to 12 months plus gallery space.
- 1. Larger size up to 38" with 32" to 38" at \$20. (Richard Hoppe and Bobbi Harrington requested this plus Maria Anthony had wanted it.)

\*\*\*\*\*\*I will make a motion that we ammend Rules for Month Take-In as follows: change "Work must be framed" to read "Paintings must be framed", The paragraph the begins "If your work, including frame measures . . ." be changed to read:

"If your work, including frame measures less than 26" on the longest side your fee is \$10, 26" and up to 31" your fee is \$15 and over 32" to 38" your fee is \$20. 38" is the maximum size allowed.

- \*An exception to the above is unusual shaped artwork, ie, extremely long and/or extremely narrow pieces where a square inch calculation would be similar.
- 2. No Dec. cash awards show -- If 5 categories at \$75, \$50 and \$25 for a total of \$800 in prizes less a possible take-in of \$400 to \$500 would equal a deficit of \$300 combined with no money from a monthly take-in (plus space problems because money brings in entries.). Very expensive!!

Rather, use the \$300 this way -- Each monthly show has a Judge's Choice which pays \$25 plus a special display of 3 pictures the following month. You now have 2 shows with different dates (12 monthly and 4 qtrly) If the wall rotation date were BEFORE the monthly show, we would know how much extra space is available. (To get around that, if Joanne on 10/3 would sell extra space on a contingent basis, ie, "yes, you can put another picture in for 3 months for \$20, but I may take that back at the end of each month and would give you money back on a pro-rata basis.") Then, the Nov monthly show take-in happens as usual.

Once it is hung, an available space list is made up. From 2:30 to 6, ANY member calls to check availability for ANY SIZE or a SECOND picture. They bring it in the next couple days and pay the sitter. (We write up a procedure for the sitters.) Then, if necessary, a wall renter with an extra picture loses the space for that month and gets a refund. Remember, a wall renter has paid \$6.67 a month; a monthly show person would pay \$10 a month for that same space.

- 3. Open up to nonmembers at \$15, \$25 and \$30. This requires getting this info into other arts groups' newsletters for at least 3 months in a row -- COAL, Fallbrook, Temecula, EAA, EAP, NCSFA, RB, Valley Center, Ramona, LaJOlla, East County, etc., etc. Fringe benefit -- they become members.
- 4. OTHER: Put commissions on ALL sales "Sell" being wall renter via newsletter -- how it is cheaper, how you can do a theme, etc. Have a membership campaign and 20% off a monthly show entry to current member who brings in a new member. Make a requirement -- in order to sell cards and prints, must be in monthly show a certain number of times a year. Remember, some monthly show people could be sitters to fulfill their work time not as physical also, some know how (Mary Lake comes to mind).

The Monthly Calendar Chairperson is responsible to check the sitting sign up calendar in the "Daily" notebook **2 weeks before it's published** for completeness.

After you've checked/completed the calendar, it is published by Laura Lyn Walker, VP of Information. For your month, the Monthly Chair makes sure the Gallery is opened and staffed. The first sitter each day will call to let you know they are there.

#### TREASURER'S ANNOUNCEMENT

As most of you know by now, the printer we use for vendor reports has died. The ink cartridges just stay at the end and don't move at all. So with this month's artist checks I sent notes instead of vendor reports, hoping to send the reports out later.

But getting a new printer was not that simple. Most printers are set up for Windows, not DOS. We will try to have the one we have repaired. But if we don't have a working printer by next time, we will again send the checks without reports.

To get the information on your report, you may come to the gallery, call up your report and take down the information, or you may call the gallery and the person on duty will call it up and read it to you.

Calling up your report is really quite easy. Just use the arrow keys to move to the far right, type the number 5 (vendor reports), type in the first and last dates of the month (or use Jan. 1 to get year to date), type in your vendor code (BLILI, for example), and press ENTER four times.

We are sorry for the inconvenience this may cause you, and we are doing our best to resolve the problem.

A reminder regarding reimbursements, most of you have this procedure down pat: remember that you need to fill out a form, attach your receipts and put them in the Treasurer's hanging file. I pick these up about once a week. Except for regular expenses like mailings and paper towels, you need board approval in writing for anything more than \$50 (\$100 for the Gallery Manager). Requests for under \$10 are usually reimbursed in cash, since our bookkeeping bill is based on the number of checks cut; this is just a reminder.

After you've checked/completed the calendar, it is published by Laura Lyn Walker, VP of Information. For your month, the Monthly Chair makes sure the Gallery is opened and staffed. The first sitter each day will call to let you know they are there.

## TREASURER'S ANNOUNCEMENT

As most of you know by now, the printer we use for

vendor reports has died. The ink cartridges just stay at the end and don't move at all. So with this month's artist checks I sent notes instead of vendor reports, hoping to send the reports out later.

But getting a new printer was not that simple. Most printers are set up for Windows, not DOS. We will try to have the one we have repaired. But if we don't have a working printer by next time, we will again send the checks without reports.

To get the information on your report, you may come to the gallery, call up your report and take down the information, or you may call the gallery and the person on duty will call it up and read it to you.

Calling up your report is really quite easy. Just use the arrow keys to move to the far right, type the number 5 (vendor reports), type in the first and last dates of the month (or use Jan. 1 to get year to date), type in your vendor code (BLILI, for example), and press ENTER four times.

We are sorry for the inconvenience this may cause you, and we are doing our best to resolve the problem.

A reminder regarding reimbursements, most of you have this procedure down pat: remember that you need to fill out a form, attach your receipts and put them in the Treasurer's hanging file. I pick these up about once a week. Except for regular expenses like mailings and paper towels, you need board approval in writing for anything more than \$50 (\$100 for the Gallery Manager). Requests for under \$10 are usually reimbursed in cash, since our bookkeeping bill is based on the number of checks cut; this is just a reminder. Lila Blinco

To become gallery renters, members must be added to a waiting list. Members must have participated in at least three monthly shows to be eligible for the waiting list. Floor renter s are exempt from this requirement. Once eligible for rental display space, all artists must be juried in by the SDAG Gallery Committee.

Display space rentals start at \$60 per quarter with a refundable deposit of \$60. There are no commissions on wall rent sales or floor rent sales. Shrink wrap and card sales carry a 15% commission to SDAG. Members renting display space are required to staff the gallery for a minimum of 3 1/2 hours per month. Shifts are 11:00 AM 2:30 or 2:30 PM to 6 PM daily.

The absolute maximum size for any piece is 32" along

any outside edge (including frame). Fee for artwork under 26" is \$10. \$15 fee for artwork over 26" and up to 32". 15% commission on sales in monthly show.

Glass may be used in all frames described above.

Paintings must be framed. Oil or acrylic paintings on wraparound canvas excepted. Frames must have multistrand wire with ends taped. The wire must reach approximately 3" from the top of the frame.

All artwork must be original. All artwork must be for sale.

Artwork should be less than two years old and not previously entered in our monthly show.

Artwork must be labeled on back with artist's name, title, category, medium and price.

Categories include: Oil and Acrylic, Water Media (includes acrylic under glass), Photography, and Other Media (includes: wood block prints, pastel, etchings, monoprints, collages, computer/digital art, etc)

Artist's entry must be in appropriate category or may be ineligible for judging.

• May enter one piece of artwork into monthly unjuried shows that have scheduled take-in times and dates, usually on the last Friday of the month.

Unfortunately, after much review, the Board has made the painful decision to close the Gallery with the last day of operations being Dec. 31, 2005. We just don't have enough capital to continue in our present location.

Since we opened our doors at our new location nine months ago, we have lost a little money each month with the last 2 months really accelerating that process. It seems that the cost involved in running a gallery just cannot be supported by our current list of active artists.

Opening and sustaining a new business is an expensive proposition. We gave the new location a real try but found that even though we have a beautiful little gallery, the lack of foot traffic and their impulse buying, has caused a substantial decrease in sales. With a decrease of sales, we have unhappy artists. Our Gallery is really for the artists' and the members' benefit. The Gallery itself doesn't make any real money for it's operating expenses. Therefore, when we have fewer members supporting our location as the right one, we have less income (quarterly renters and monthly show art) to keep it running. At this time, we just don't have the capital to continue past December without draining our account totally.

Our Guild membership has been changing over the years. Did you know the Guild was first started in 1965 by a group of 12 enthusiastic artists living in this area? We're one of the longest standing guilds in this area. At this time, many of the members are trying to be active artists, using their artwork to support them or supplement their income. But with other jobs and active family lives, members are changing how they are able to participate in our Guild. During this time of closing the gallery, the board will actively look at how we can recreate and restructure the activities of Guild so that we will have many opportunities for future involvement and exhibiting our artwork.
