Artist's work showcased at San Dieguito Art Guild's 'Living Mother's Day Weekend Art Studio and Garden Tour'

East County artist and the successful large-scale art pieces of local artist Lia Kondilis, a member of the San Dieguito Art Guild.

The inspiration for the tour is Lia's love of art, her philosophy coupled with a large-scale, colorful, free-flowing abstract, and with her love of the outdoors, which is reflected in her artwork.

Working at a professional gallery, depicting Asian culture, Kondilis now finds a new kind of freedom in experimenting with abstract concepts and unique architectural structures.

Her ability to work in different mediums has created a diverse collection of art which will be available for viewing and purchase during the weekend of May 10 and 11 when members of the San Dieguito Art Guild will track Lia's work, with its unique style, for their annual Mother's Day Weekend Art Tour.

One of the tour's highlights are the home and garden of Lia and her son, Kondilis, located in the San Valley area. Lia's home is a beautiful, modern, and comfortable. Inspired by Greek island architecture, Kondilis' light-colored home, designed to provide a sense of openness, is a perfect example of a modern home with a personal touch. Kondilis' home is a perfect example of a modern home with a personal touch.

"I paint in practically all mediums," Kondilis said in a recent interview. "I do oil, acrylic, watercolor, mixed media, any way I get my hands on. I love to experiment."

"Color is also very important in my work," she said. "I use color to create a sense of movement and to create a sense of balance. And Kondilis' husband, John, is also a very important part of her work."

She also loves the process of working on her art. "It's a challenging task, but it's also a very rewarding one," she said. "I love the process of creating something new, and I love the process of sharing it with others. I love the process of creating something new, and I love the process of sharing it with others."

The art guild's self-guided tour includes gardens and studios in Del Mar, Solana Beach, and Encinitas. Organized by guild members—a non-profit community arts group founded in 1964—the tour showcases several artists' work. One hundred percent of ticket sales go toward the art guild, said Kondilis, and in each location there will be multiple artists representing a variety of mediums: print, jewelry, ceramics, sculpture, glass, textiles and paintings.

Active in the Del Mar Art Center, and a member of the Encinitas-based San Dieguito Art Guild for several years, Kondilis has also showcased her work at the Arts for Healing Exhibition in Scripps Memorial Hospital in Encinitas.

"I exhibited 24 of my paintings there. Twenty percent of the sales go to the hospital foundation but it also serves to help promote the artists. It was a wonderful experience, even while I was hanging my pieces. I got so much energy from the people, so much interest," she said.

Kondilis depicts local seascapes and landscapes in oil; Asian brush paintings in watercolor; abstracts in mixed media; and animals and portraits in oil and acrylic.

Her background includes an international upbringing. Born in South Korea in 1960, Kondilis was the youngest of three sisters with a younger brother. Her father, a business man, died when she was just 12 years old. "It was a big shock," said Kondilis who was very close to her father. "I still have a fear of loved ones dying."

At the age of 14 Kondilis was sent with her older sister, Meekyung, to live and study in the United States. "My mother thought that this would be better for us. We went to a little private boarding school called Cushing Academy in Massachusetts where we stayed for a year."

The whole street comprised the school campus, with the headmaster's house at the end of the street and dormitories down each side. "It was very beautiful, just how I had imagined America to be," Kondilis said. Meekyung is now an haute couture designer in South Korea, she added.

Following the year in Massachusetts the girls were transferred to Monterrey to a private Catholic School called Santa Catalina. It was here that

While in France, Kondilis attended the prestigious Sorbonne School. "I loved Paris, the energy and the culture," she recalled. But she then returned to California to pursue her art career.

In California Kondilis attended the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, studying graphic design. "I was kind of surprised that they accepted me," admitted Kondilis candidly—she had no talent but no significant portfolio. Then when Stavros' business required she relocate to San Diego, Kondilis left the school prior to graduation to assist him in his property business. The two had married in 1987.

When the business was sold, the purchase of property in San Valley brought Stavros and Lia Kondilis to Del Mar. It was this move that rekindled Kondilis' desire to paint. She now works prolifically creating pieces that form diptychs and triptychs—two and three panel groupings—that may be displayed in motion or separated as stand alone pieces, and huge canvases.

Her paintings are found in national and international collections including those of members of the Washington D. C. Diplomatic Corp. Kondilis is a member of the San Diego Art Institute, Museum of Living Artists. Word of mouth helps clients seek out Kondilis who is able to custom design large scale pieces to fit a client's home space. Her current work is also available for sale during the Mother's Day Tour and she will be accepting commissions for custom work.

"Initially when I started painting seriously, I wasn't thinking about selling my art. I wanted to decorate my own house most of all. But people were interested in buying it and I got commissions from local collectors. I was truly amazed."

Artist's work showcased at San Dieguito Art Guild's 'Mother's Day Weekend Art Studio and Garden Tour'

East meets West in the masterful large-scale art pieces of local artist Lia Kondilis, a member of the San Dieguito Art Guild.

The inspiration for her art is drawn from an eastern minimalist philosophy coupled with a large scale, western, free flowing abstraction; and with brilliant color energetically worked into her canvasses, Kondilis' art pieces make a dramatic statement.

Working in watercolors initially, depicting Asian themes, Kondilis now finds a new found freedom in experimenting with abstract canvasses and sensitive representational landscapes.

Her ability to work in different mediums has created a diverse collection much of which will be available for viewing and purchase during the weekend of May 10 and 11 when members of the San Dieguito Art Guild / Off Track Gallery will be opening their homes for their annual Mother's Day Weekend Art Tour.

One of the eight tour stops are the home and gardens of Lia and Stavros Kondilis nestled in the Sun Valley area between Rancho Santa Fe and Solana Beach. Inspired by Greek island architecture, Kondilis' light infused home - designed in partnership with her husband in 1999 - with its massive windows and expansive white walls serves as a personal gallery for her collection of large scale art.

I paint in practically all mediums," Kondilis said in a recent interview, "I go back and forth between oil, acrylic, watercolors, mixed media, anything I get my hands on. I love to experiment."

"Color is also very important in my work because color changes mood and affects the observer," she affirmed. And Kondilis' brilliantly vibrant images do provoke a response.

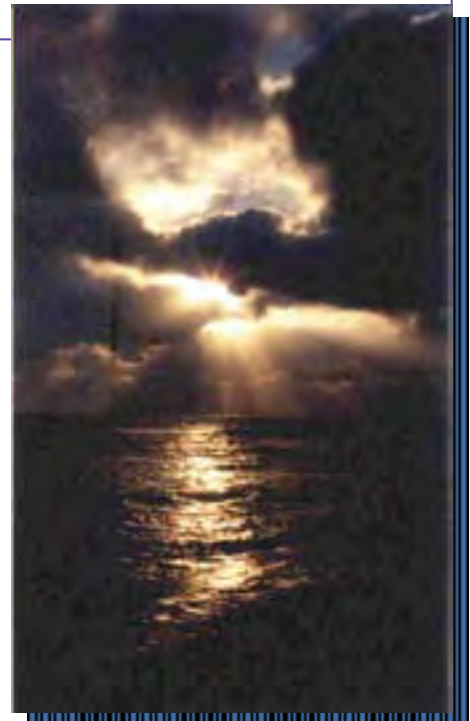

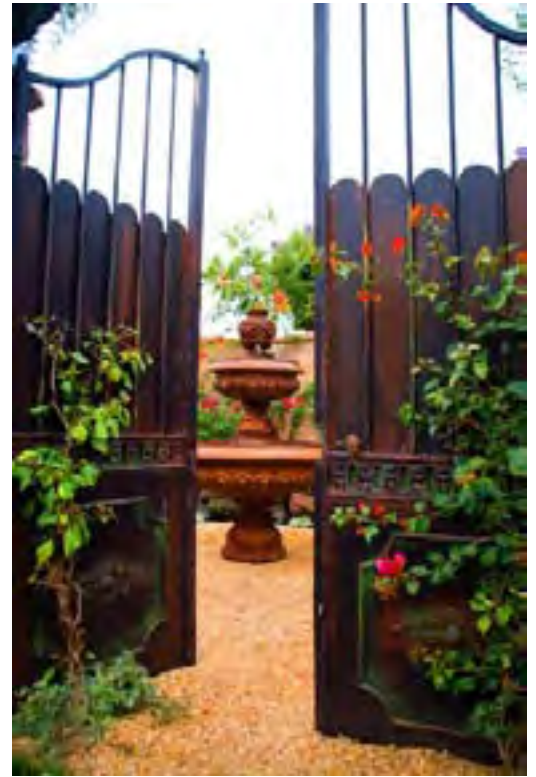

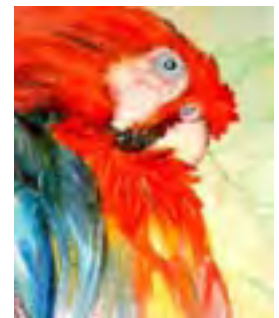

Oceanside man accused of stomping dog to death

An Oceanside gang member on parole was arraigned on felony animal-cruelty charges yesterday in the stomping death Sunday of a little white dog named Princess.

Jeffrey Atkinson, 43, pleaded not guilty in Vista Superior Court to the cruelty charge. Investigators said he killed the dog at his apartment near Tiburon Drive and threw its body into a trash bin.

Judge Marshall Hockett increased Atkinson's bail from \$25,000 to \$50,000 due to the severity of the crime and his previous convictions. A preliminary hearing was set for May 19.

Court records show Atkinson has prior felony and misdemeanor convictions, including for robbery.

"It's just frustrating that someone would be this cruel to an animal," Deputy District Attorney Robert Knox said. "This is pretty horrible ... We don't

A new addition to the tour this year is the Secret Garden of Trish Kydd. Kydd is a landscape artist whose motto is "A gardener is an artist who paints the world with flowers."

She owned Anderson's La Costa Nursery for a decade before starting her own Encinitas-based business devoted to building themed gardens.

"I think everyone's garden, no matter how little, should have a theme and plants with some water requirements," Kydd said. "If you have a tangle-jumble, the plants won't thrive. It's one thing to draw it on paper; it's another to actually get in there and do the construction. I once used acrylics and oils. But, I'd rather be outside working on a garden than sitting behind a drafting table drawing it."

Kydd's location isn't a residence but an out-of-the-way business where Kydd brings clients who are looking for inspiration. During the tour, visitors can walk through eight verdant vignettes that reflect a specific mood.

The whimsical, small-scale house in the Cottage Garden has a moss roof, white-framed windows and a front yard overrun with daisies and scented geraniums.

In a garden called the Ruins, a statue of the winged Greek goddess Nike rises up from a half-circle fountain that stands in front of 20-foot Egyptian doors, flanked by weathered pillars.

Each walk through garden is filled with details that add visual interest. Kydd said she enjoys the hunt for unusual items and her gardens feature everything from towering cast-iron Tuscan gates to tiny white stone bunnies that peek from beneath tall grasses.

An English courtyard is shaded by a ceiling of open beams that support a black wrought-iron candelabra; blooming succulents burst from old English urns and a forest pansy red-bud tree decorates a stone walkway.

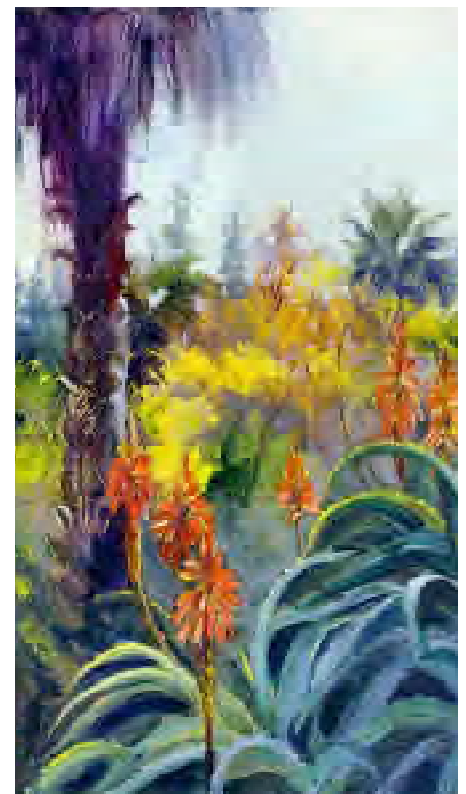

These instructions are for the monthly wall art only.

- The Monthly Show art changes each month. When you come to the Gallery for take-in please have your temporary take-in tag and take-in sheet (PDF files sent along with The Paint Rag) filled out.
- Three pieces of artwork are allowed if space permits.
- Your work must have some identification on the back.
- Do not bring in wet paintings or frames.
- Giclee's are acceptable as long as they are well marked, but will not be included in the judging.
- A 10% commission will be charged on sales from the monthly wall art (same rate as all other art in the gallery), plus a 5.4% credit card fee if a credit card is used for the purchase.
- Work must be framed unless you use the wrap-around canvas stapled in back.
- The wire should be the multi-strand wire (not the saw-toothed hanger typical of ready-made frames) attached as per the Picture Hanging System 3-22-08 document attached.
- Please tape the ends of the wire, and please don't put tape or tubing in the middle of the wire.
- If your work, including frame, measures:
under 17" on the diagonal the fee is \$10.00,
17" to 36" on the diagonal, the fee is \$15.00.
over 36" on the diagonal, your fee is \$20.00.

Measure carefully.

- Artists may show 1 or 2 or 3 pieces depending on available gallery wall space.
- Be sure your work looks as nice as it can, with clean, well put-together frame, clean glass and a well-cut mat.
- The Take-in committee reserves the right to refuse entries that do not meet gallery standards.
