Off Track Gallery Summer Satellite at the Lumberyard A Proposal to Grubb-Ellis, 4/1/09

It has come to our attention that several of the spaces managed by your firm in the Lumberyard in downtown Encinitas are vacant, presumably a result of the current economic slowdown. We would like to propose a mutually beneficial arrangement that would utilize one of the vacancies as an art gallery this summer, and possibly ongoing until the space is needed for other tenants. We propose an agreement whereby the San Dieguito Art Guild (SDAG) would operate an attractive art gallery featuring the works of talented local artists in the vacant space directly behind the St. Tropez Bistro & Bakery. SDAG would pay Grubb-Ellis the costs of maintenance and utilities, in addition to 20% of total sales each month. This type of arrangement has been successful at the Del Mar Plaza, where the Del Mar Art Center operated a gallery between 2000 and 2007. The arrangement has been reestablished this March due to increased vacancies in the Plaza.

SDAG has been a non-profit organization supporting art and artists in the greater Encinitas community for over 30 years. We currently have over 170 members and operate the Off Track Gallery (OTG) at the corner of Second and D Streets in Encinitas. We feature monthly shows at the gallery as well as off-site shows at a number of different venues, including the Encinitas Library and City Hall. Our bi-monthly Featured Artist Receptions consistently draw over two hundred guests and excellent media coverage.

The benefits to Grubb-Ellis would include:

- · Increased traffic for your current tenants at no cost to them or you
- · Customers and potential tenants will experience a more active retail center
- Increased publicity for the Lumberyard (we will stage monthly receptions)
- 20% commission on total monthly sales (Monthly OTG sales on Second Street range between \$2500 and \$9000; sales in the Lumberyard would likely be higher)
- Potential tax write-off for defraying the cost of rent to our non-profit
- Recognition, if desired, for supporting a community service
- Ability to terminate the arrangement at any time with 30 days notice:

Excluded from Gross Sales shall be (i) refunds to customers on transactions otherwise included in Gross Sales; and (ii) sales, excise or similar tax imposed by governmental authorities and collected from customers and paid out by Licensee. WITNESSETH

In consideration of the mutual Premises, covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- Owner hereby grants to User a License to occupy and use, subject to all of the terms and conditions hereinafter stated, that portion of said Shopping Center more specifically described and designated on the sketch map labeled Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Owner reserves the right to relocate User to another location within the center at Owner's option and/or terminate this License Agreement with advanced written 30 day notice.
- Such portion of the Shopping Center may be occupied and used by the User solely for the purpose as described in Exhibit "B", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- TERM: User shall use the Premises under this license for the dates set forth in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- RENT: User shall pay the Owner the amounts as described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- SALES: User shall report monthly gross sales for the term of the agreement by the fifth (5th) day following the end of the preceding month.
- User shall at all times during its use of the Premises provide sufficient supervision and maintain adequate control of its employees, guests, or invitees.
- In the event there are any license, or permits required by any governmental agency or authority with respect to the type of activity carried on and/or the use of the Premises.

Artist creates sandy work for young couple in love

ENCINITAS marriage proposal works best when it's memorable. Friends and fami-

ly will want to hear the story told and retold, and a grand display of affection can speak volumes about a person's devotion.



Wanting his proposal to be just right, Encinitas resident Jay Brant got help from a Leucadia artist to show his dedication on Leucadia's biggest canvas, Stonesteps Beach.

Saturday morning, Brant had news of an "emergency." A pod of dolphins, lost on their migratory path, had come ashore and needed help.

Kim Schreiner, his girlfriend since high school, rushed out the door to the rescue.

Arriving at the scene, she found no dolphins (the beached cetaceans had been a ruse to lure her to the beach) but instead, a circular labyrinth drawn in the sand ringed with

hearts, at least 40 feet wide, with "Marry me Kim" inscribed at the center.

"She asked on the way over, 'Are you lying to me?' " said Brant.

The couple moved to Enciritiss in October from Indianapolis, and the beach holds special memories for them; Brant says they visited there to watch their first sunset after moving.

The artist in charge of creating the message in the sand was Leucadian Kirk Van Allyn. Van Allyn has, for 10 years working under the name Kirkos, created larger than-life designs on beaches.

across Van Allyn's week at the beach, and while Brant was planning how to pop the question, the artist's name came to mind.

"It was a loving thing," said Van Allyn. "It's nice to see something that makes people smile."

After the proposal, Jay and Kim stood by as beachgoers gathered, admiring the message (and Schreiner's ring).

Even passing joggers down below paid the display courtesy, running around the circle to avoid trampling it.

"It's wonderful," said Schreiner of ber fiance's theatrics, "it surpasses all of my expectations, and I didn't expect it at all."

Only afterward, as the couple turned to leave, did she add, "So now, who's going to plan this?"

Off-Track Gallery & SDAG News Items

Deborrah Henry

The San Dieguito Art Guild is very pleased to announce their newest member — with enough talent to fill an entire room of the Off Track Gallery.

Deborrah Henry is a fiber artist who has authored "The Simple Art of Ribbon Design". She also works in a variety of mixed media, but her favorite medium for expression is fine art photography and digital art. She loves creating photographic books. She has also been a psychotherapist and children's art teacher.

In Deborrah's own words, "Thoughts on photography and spirituality: Looking beyond the surface and past the physical can be a spiritual experience. As with photography, when an image expresses beauty, friendships between elements are crucial. Line, form, rhythm, color, shape and size are all important elements in art and photography. The patterns of unfoldment seen in a close-up image of a flower reveal natural beauty and its developing heart. Whether it is specific patterns revealed in nature or minute detail in the tiniest of spaces, the Creator has an amazing awareness to be able to run the world and create such beauty at the same time. This belief compels me to try and see the true, natural beauty in nature and the world."

During the months of February and March Deborrah's room will feature her India Series including her book "Simply India, a photographic diary", photographs, jewelry and mixed media. Next, look for her Floral Collection, Beach Collection, Doors (in the Fall) and Moods (next Winter).

Have you ever wondered what the name San Dieguito means?

The name San Dieguito, meaning "Little San Diego," was created to identify an area close to and north of San Diego, where the San Dieguito River flows through a valley and empties into San Dieguito Lagoon and then into the ocean just north of today's city of Del Mar. Ten thousand years ago, a group of Indians we now call the San Dieguito lived in the lagoons of this area. Later, Spanish rancheros raised longhorn cattle on the surrounding hills and in the valleys, and in the 1840's, a land grant of 8,825 acres called Rancho San Dieguito was given to Juan Maria Osuna. The center of this Rancho would be near today's Rancho Santa Fe. Just north of Rancho San Dieguito, a 4,431-acre parcel of land was given to Don Andres Ybarra in 1842 by Gov. Juan Bautista Alvarado, and this was called Rancho Las Encinitas. These two ranchos and some surrounding land were settled and farmed by Europeans and American citizens from eastern states starting in the 1880's, and this entire area became known as San Dieguito.

Additional signs for the Off Track Gallery on Highway 101?

Several Guild members have asked the board why we do not have a sign or a sandwich board on Highway 101 to direct people to our gallery. While this is a logical question and could be a good way to draw customers our way, this is what President, Patricia Eldon, was told by the city of Encinitas Planning Department:

- 1. The City Planner said that although we are a non-profit company, we are not a public company. Therefore we are not allowed to put a sign on public property. Hence no sign on the street lamps as had been suggested.
- 2. The rule booklet also states that no permanent signs that are offsite from one's business are allowed. Therefore, we are not allowed to put a permanent sign on the wall of another business, such as Raul's Taco shop or the nearby 7-11, even if they were to give permission.
- 3. We can put up a temporary sandwich board on another businesses' property only with their permission. However, when asked, the manager of the nearby 7-11 stated that it was against their corporate policy.

San Dieguito Art Guild History

The Guild was started in 1965 in Del Mar. After three years in the building that is now the Del Mar Library (which the Guild COULD have purchased -- but decided not to -- for \$60,000, which is about \$356,000 in today's money), they moved to the "Chateau" or one of the "Honeymoon Cottages" as it was also called. They were forced to move because the building they were in was sold to become the Albatross Restaurant.

The "Chateau" was once part of the Old Del Mar Hotel (where the L'Auberge Hotel is now). This "Chateau" building that once housed the San Dieguito Art Guild is still standing and is now a private residence. Going north on highway 101 in Del Mar, turn west on 15th Street, and just as you turn the corner going toward Jake's Restaurant, the old train depot and the railroad tracks, the old "Chateau" building is on your right surrounded by a very tall hedge. It is a tudorstyle building.

The Guild had their Chateau Gallery on the first floor, with workshops and a full-time, live-in host and hostess living above. The rent for that whole building was only \$150 per month (about \$890 in today's dollars).

- All work must be original (or prints made from your own original) and for sale.
- TAKE-IN IS THE LAST TUESDAY OF THE MONTH from 9:30 am – Noon. (Holidays may change this date, so check the calendar on the cover of the Paint Rag.)
- Please have your take-in sheet and take-in tags (found in the Paint Rag) already filled out for take in day.
- Work must be framed unless you use wrap-around canvas stapled on the back (no staples on the sides).
 Frames must be attached professionally (check the guide-lines posted in the gallery or on the SDAG website). No bent-over nails or staples to hold the frame.
- The wires should be attached to wall art 1/4 to 1/5 of the way down from the top of the frame.
- You must have your name and the title of your piece on the reverse of your work.
- Do not bring wet paintings.
- You must have a multi-strand wire (please do not use the saw-toothed hangers that usually come with ready made frames) attached securely approximately ¼ of the way down from the top of frame and slack enough to come to approximately 2 inches from the top of the frame. Please tape the ends of the wire (loose wire ends can cut the hands of those doing the hanging).
- Be sure your work looks as nice as it can, well puttogether frame, clean well-cut mat.
- The Guild reserves the right to refuse entries that do not meet SDAG standards.
- Prints made from original art (such as Giclees) must clearly be identified as reproductions/prints (this includes those in the shrink wrap bin). California state law requires all reproductions to be numbered editions. Buyers deserve to know the number of copies available. Signed editions are generally thought of as more valuable to collectors. NOTE: Giclees are not included in the judging.
- Calligraphy as part of the art piece is acceptable.

SHRINK WRAP SPECIFICATIONS

Each SDAG member may show 2 large and 5 small shrink—wrap pieces. There is no charge for showing shrink-wraps. Shrink-wraps have 10% commission on them. They must be enclosed in crystal clear envelopes with the artist name, the title and the price of the art piece clearly readable and in a place that it can be seen from the outside of the envelope. Full size shrink-wraps should not be any larger then the art bin. Small size shrink-wrap should be 9"x12" or smaller. All shrink-wraps should have a backing made from either 'backing board' or mat board, cut carefully to fit the size of the work. Total thickness of package must not exceed 1/4". Please: no ragged edges or thick backing or thick foam core since it takes up too much room in the bins. All shrink-wraps should be clearly marked: ORIGINAL OR PRINT.

CARD RACK SPECIFICATIONS

Every member can show cards and use 2 card slots if there is room on the rack. Artists do not pay commission on cards and there is no charge for displaying cards. All card requests must go through Barb Mille'.



Excavation Complete at Pacific Station in Encinitas

Site excavation is complete and pouring of foundations has commenced at Pacific Station, the new \$40 million mixed-use development located at 687 South Coast Highway 101, in the heart of downtown Encinitas.

More than 37,000 cubic yards of sand was removed from the site to make room for the project's underground parking. The beach-quality sand was transferred to eroded beach areas near Ponto State Beach in northern Encinitas, according to John DeWald of Cardiff-based John DeWald & Associates, lead development partner in the Pacific Station project.

Developed by John DeWald & Associates, in conjunction with Phase 3 Properties, Inc., Pacific Station will offer approximately 40,000 square feet of prime retail space, including a Whole Foods Market, a restaurant, small shops, some 9,000 square feet of professional office space, and 47 upscale residential town home condominiums -- all constructed over two floors of underground parking.

Located next to the Encinitas transit center, one block from the civic center and downtown library and just a few blocks from Moonlight Beach, Pacific Station represents a new direction in urban beach living. Pacific Station's residential architecture is an Encinitas-inspired eclectic mix of two-story townhomes, two-story lofts and single-story flats ranging from approximately 600 to 2,400 square feet in size.

Reception volunteers needed

Volunteers needed to help with the popular Featured Artist Receptions. We need volunteers to with set-up and clean-up also need someone to be in charge of handling the raffle. What a great opportunity to help and have fun at the same time!

At the Leucadia Art Walk meeting this morning, I did as some of you requested and asked for more spaces and for a better location and to have the guild artists' names listed.

Paula said that none of the artists' names are on listed on the LeucadiArt Walk map, but that she is willing to name our artists on the poster, along with the other artists if we send in our artists' names soon enough, which I think we always do.

The committee members voted that we can have up to 15 spaces if we pay \$50.00 more, a total of \$300, which would be \$20.00 an artist. Otherwise, if we pay only \$250.00, which we have already done, then we can have 12 or 13 spaces. We can crowd as many artists into those spaces as we want, with some artists perhaps having only one or two items each, for all they care. They are giving us the Travel Trust parking lot again this year, and we may do things to try to make it more attractive, such as having demo artists or stilt-walkers. We will be at the most southern point of Art Walk this year.

Morgan Mallory of the Corner Frame Shop said that, although he knows that San Dieguito Art Guild helped to get Leucadia Art Walk started, he thinks that it is very unfair to the other Art Walk artists that our guild pays only \$20 or \$30 an artist, while the non-guild artists have to pay \$60.00 if returning or \$70.00 if new this year or \$90.00 if late at registering. He repeated this again and again. Morgan thinks that our requests are an insult to the organizers of Art Walk and that we are being greedy.

He thinks if our members want a better location, they can pay the usual fee. He says that if we want to be at Leucadia Roadside Park, the best spot, we should pay the fee and be juried in like the other artists. He doesn't think we should be asking for more spaces for the \$250.00 that we paid, and that we already have an unfair deal..

Morgan was against our having a children's art project in our guild's area and having us advertise about it. He thinks it may draw the crowd away from the already- planned children's art project, which Yanina Cambareri, as program director of "Reason to Survive, The Arts," will run at Head Start, a preschool along Hwy 101. This organization has already made a commitment to do a children's project, a large banner and some individual projects. I told Morgan that I didn't think that our guild cared much about whether or not we did a children's art project, and that if we

did, it would be something quick and easy, such as fish printing. He still though it would make the crowd come to our end of the walk, and not to the other kids' project.

The other committee members thought it would be fine with them if we had a children's art project or did other work to make this "a kick-ass" event, as they worded it.

Mallory thinks we should help to make Art Walk as a whole a success, and not just make our own part attractive.

I observed that with the economy being so bad, many of the merchants along Hwy 101 in Leucadia are probably hurting financially, and that last year they were being asked to pay \$50.00 or more each to have their names on the art walk map. The merchants on the committee are doing work to organize and advertise Leucadia Art Walk and to provide musicians, stiltwalkers, face-painters, and the children's art project. There may be a barbeque organized by Carolyn Cope near the Leucadia Post Office, I think.. Maybe there may be a wine grotto at Gold Coast.

It was hard to get a word in with Mallory repeating what he thought again and again.

After 45 minutes, they were finished talking about our issues, and I left for a class that I am taking.

After the meeting, I looked in your Leucadia Art Walk file, Susan, and saw that, although 16 people have e-mailed that they want to participate, some by sharing a space with another artist, there were only two checks in your file, and one of them was from myself.

Meet ELAINE SEELEY, Judge for the May, 2009 Monthly Art Show at the Off Track Gallery

s. Seeley is a sculptor and art educator who has exhibited on both coasts as well as taught art and sculpture courses for over twenty-five years.



Her training began on the East Coast where she received a Bachelors and Masters degree in Art and Education from the New York State University system. Her graduate school emphasis was sculpture and new approaches to teaching sculpture to children and adults.

She has received grants from the California Arts Council to teach sculpture as an Artist-In-Residence in the San Diego public schools. In addition to teaching, Ms. Seeley founded and operated a business that provided creative art projects for elementary school-aged children. These products were sold to schools, churches, and museum enrichment programs throughout the United States and were designed to foster the children's interest in 3-dimensional art.

Ms. Seeley has exhibited in New York regional art shows and has had several solo showings on the East Coast. Since moving to California, she has received awards in many regional juried shows. In addition to solo exhibitions, she has participated in group exhibitions in San Diego, La Jolla, Encinitas, and Carlsbad. A long time member of the San Diego Art Institute, Ms. Seeley is also a member of the Carlsbad Oceanside Art League and the San Dieguito Art Guild, exhibiting often at these venues.

Ms. Seeley works primarily in stainless steel, copper, and brass, making her works suitable for the garden as well as indoors. The human figure is of special interest to her, working first in clay from a live model. Her figures range from small to life-size.

Artist's Statement

My training in sculpture was classical with hours spent drawing the figure, studying anatomy, and modeling figures in clay. I have worked with all sculpture media and processes; carving, modeling, casting, and construction.

Many years of hard work and dedication has paid its rewards for Grace Swanson of Encinitas. Grace's involvement with the San Dieguito Art Guild includes much more than painting excellent art pieces, she has been instrumental in organizing and coordinating the guild's latest galleries in Encinitas, promoting the guild, researching and documenting the history of the guild as well as serving on the board of directors. In recognition for many years of effort she has been rewarded with a lifetime membership in the guild. This rare reward has been given to very few people in the forty two history of the San Dieguito Art Guild. Most recently Grace's mixed media piece won the Best of Show honors in June's monthly show at the Off Track Gallery. Her piece titled "Matilija Poppy" was first painted in watercolor, then acrylic on Masa paper, which has been glued to a stretched canvas. This was then covered gently with a layer of semi gloss soft gel. When that was completely dry, the painting was sealed with a satin finish varnish. Matilija poppies are a California native plant that can be seen in bloom all around our local coastal canyons and hillsides during this time of year and are easily recognized by the large white flower that looks like a fried egg. Grace explains "I love to paint flowers. What attracts me first is the color. Then the structure and the delicacy. Although I try usually to paint realistically, I love to enhance, change, and simplify the configuration and color of the flowers and leaves". Her skill and creativity are reflected in the winning painting as well as her other work shown in the background in this image of Grace at the galley where her work and the work of many other local artists can be viewed and purchased seven days a week at the Off Track Gallery located at 500 Second Street in Encinitas.
