Off Track Gallery Summer Satellite at the Lumberyard A Proposal to Grubb-Ellis, 4/1/09

It has come to our attention that several of the spaces managed by your firm in the Lumberyard in downtown Encinitas are vacant, presumably a result of the current economic slowdown. We would like to propose a mutually beneficial arrangement that would utilize one of the vacancies as an art gallery this summer, and possibly ongoing until the space is needed for other tenants. We propose an agreement whereby the San Dieguito Art Guild (SDAG) would operate an attractive art gallery featuring the works of talented local artists in the vacant space directly behind the St. Tropez Bistro & Bakery. SDAG would pay Grubb-Ellis the costs of maintenance and utilities, in addition to 20% of total sales each month. This type of arrangement has been successful at the Del Mar Plaza, where the Del Mar Art Center operated a gallery between 2000 and 2007. The arrangement has been reestablished this March due to increased vacancies in the Plaza.

SDAG has been a non-profit organization supporting art and artists in the greater Encinitas community for over 30 years. We currently have over 170 members and operate the Off Track Gallery (OTG) at the corner of Second and D Streets in Encinitas. We feature monthly shows at the gallery as well as off-site shows at a number of different venues, including the Encinitas Library and City Hall. Our bi-monthly Featured Artist Receptions consistently draw over two hundred guests and excellent media coverage.

The benefits to Grubb-Ellis would include:

- Increased traffic for your current tenants at no cost to them or you
- Customers and potential tenants will experience a more active retail center
- Increased publicity for the Lumberyard (we will stage monthly receptions)
- 20% commission on total monthly sales (Monthly OTG sales on Second Street range between \$2500 and \$9000; sales in the Lumberyard would likely be higher)
- Potential tax write-off for defraying the cost of rent to our non-profit
- Recognition, if desired, for supporting a community service
- Ability to terminate the arrangement at any time with 30 days notice

We look forward to discussing this proposal with you at your earliest convenience.

### History of the San Dieguito Art Guild

ur guild was actually started in Del Mar. The gallery was located in three different locations in Del Mar before moving to Encinitas.

While still in Del Mar, the president for the 1971-1972 was Mrs. Harold (Dee) Wilhelmy. This is significant because in the late 1970s when the guild lost its location at the Chateau in Del Mar it moved into a building behind the frame shop (on Highway 101 in Leucadia) which was owned by the Wilhelmys. That's how the guild ended up going from Del Mar to Encinitas.

The president for the 1972-1973 term was Mary Ellen Melton. An article on page 12 of "WESTART" in the February 18, 1972 issue noted these North San Diego County Art Galleries:

CHATEAU ART GALLERY, operated by the San Dieguito Art Guild, 110 15th St. Del Mar, was originally built as the Honeymoon Cottage, part of the old Del Mar Hotel Complex, which was razed a few years back. The house contains 12 rooms and 10 baths and is built on three levels. The first level is used as gallery space by the Guild. The second is the apartment of the present gallery keeper, Syd Sowers. The third level is used as studio space by various artists. Presently the South Gallery on the first level has been given over to the Robert Freeman students from the Rincon Indian Reservation. Freeman has been working with these children for some time, with excellent results. Their work as a whole shows much promise and imagination. The Guild and other art groups are enthusiastically helping the Freeman project by donating art materials for the children's use. An Art Mart is held every Sunday at the corner of the Hwy and 15th St. While this is not a Guild project, some of the participating artists are Guild members.

**CARMEL VALLEY WEAVERS**, Del Mar. Weavers and other related handicrafts.

**RED BOX,** Del Mar. Doll shop with many handcrafted dolls.

**DEL MAR GALLERY**, Del Mar. Glass and metal sculpture, pottery, jewelry and craft items.

**CLAUSE STUDIO**, Del Mar. It is more of an experience than a gallery per se, appealing to young people, who consider their art a way of life, complete with super light shows and encounter sessions.

**CAROUSEL GALLERY**, Encinitas. Many local artists with accent on monthly one-man shows.

**BERIDE GALLERY**, Encinitas. Small but sophisticated. Coffee house, **LA PALOMA**, Encinitas.

**HAROLD'S GALLERY**, Encinitas. This was one of the first art galleries in North County.

**THE LITTLE OLD RINGMAKER**, Leucadia. Fine handmade jewelry some Indian cultural art.

NORM'S HANDCRAFTED STONEWARE, Encinitas. WILHELMY'S, Leucadia. Framing and art gallery.

he City of Encinitas will host an Environmental Art Exhibition to take place at the Encinitas Library June 1-July 16, 2009. The exhibit theme is Reuse, Reinvent, Recycle. All San Diego artists are encouraged to submit entries.

A total of \$1,300 in cash prizes will be awarded to the Best of Show and First Place winners. Artist Applications are available on the city website www.cityofencinitas.org under City News and Events. Artists may also email Jim Gilliam to receive an application: jgilliam@cityofencinitas.org. The deadline to submit an application is Wednesday, May 20, 2009.

"Submitted artworks may be reasonably considered 'environmental art' if they are entirely, or primarily, composed of at least 85% material that would otherwise have been disposed of in waste streams," stated Paul Gagliardo, Chairman of the Commission for the Arts. The exhibit will include 2 and 3-dimensional artworks as well as functional items that fall into the realm of industrial design and wearable art.

The artwork in the exhibit will be organized in four categories:

- 1) Mixed Media-Wall Hanging,
- 2) Mixed Media-Free Standing,
- 3) Function-waste materials into a working invention, and,
- 4) Fashion-wearable art.

The exhibition will be judged by Laura Birns ASID, LEED AP, Member of the Sustainable Furnishings Council and a Certified Green Build Professional; Jacy Bolden, Encinitas Environmental Commission Coordinator and former Director of the Solana Center; Ron Lemen, artist and educator, Co-owner, Studio 2nd Street and a Member of the California Art Club; and Bart Smith AIA, Principal, DZN Partners Architecture and President, Palomar Chapter of the AIA.

The exhibition will be held at the Encinitas Library, 540 Cornish Drive in Encinitas. The library is open Monday - Thursday, 9:30 AM - 8 PM; Friday - Saturday, 9:30 AM - 5 PM; and Sunday, 1 - 5 PM.

Terry will deliver orders to the Gallery every Thursday. You will then pick up your order at the Gallery and leave her a check (made out to Terry Oshrin, NOT the Guild) in her file folder in the store room filing cabinet.

#### **Monthly Show Rules**

- There is 10 % commission on wall and floor art and shrink wraps. There is no commission on cards. An approximate 5% is charged for credit card sales.
- All work must be original (or prints made from your own original) and for sale.
- TAKE-IN IS THE LAST TUESDAY OF THE MONTH from 9:30 am – Noon. (Holidays may change this date, so check the calendar on the cover of the Paint Rag.)
- Please have your take-in sheet and take-in tags (found in the Paint Rag) already filled out for take in day.
- Work must be framed unless you use wrap-around canvas stapled on the back (no staples on the sides).
   Frames must be attached professionally (check the guide-lines posted in the gallery or on the SDAG website). No bent-over nails or staples to hold the frame.
- The wires should be attached to wall art 1/4 to 1/5 of the way down from the top of the frame.
- You must have your name and the title of your piece on the reverse of your work.
- Do not bring wet paintings.
- You must have a multi-strand wire (please do not use the saw-toothed hangers that usually come with ready made frames) attached securely approximately ¼ of the way down from the top of frame and slack enough to come to approximately 2 inches from the top of the frame. Please tape the ends of the wire (loose wire ends can cut the hands of those doing the hanging).
- Be sure your work looks as nice as it can, well puttogether frame, clean well-cut mat.
- The Guild reserves the right to refuse entries that do not meet SDAG standards.
- Prints made from original art (such as Giclees) must clearly be identified as reproductions/prints (this includes those in the shrink wrap bin). California state law requires all reproductions to be numbered editions. Buyers deserve to know the number of copies available. Signed editions are generally thought of as more valuable to collectors. NOTE: Giclees are not included in the judging.
- Calligraphy as part of the art piece is acceptable.

#### SHRINK WRAP SPECIFICATIONS

Each SDAG member may show 2 large and 5 small shrink—wrap pieces. There is no charge for showing shrink-wraps. Shrink-wraps have 10% commission on them. They must be enclosed in crystal clear envelopes with the artist name, the title and the price of the art piece clearly readable and in a place that it can be seen from the outside of the envelope. Full size shrink-wraps should not be any larger then the art bin. Small size shrink-wrap should be 9"x12" or smaller. All shrink-wraps should have a backing made from either 'backing board' or mat board, cut carefully to fit the size of the work. Total thickness of package must not exceed 1/4". Please: no ragged edges or thick backing or thick foam core since it takes up too much room in the bins. All shrink-wraps should be clearly marked: ORIGINAL OR PRINT.

#### **CARD RACK SPECIFICATIONS**

Every member can show cards and use 2 card slots if there is room on the rack. Artists do not pay commission on cards and there is no charge for displaying cards. All card requests must go through Barb Mille'.





#### **Monthly Show Rules**

- There is 10 % commission on wall and floor art and shrink wraps. There is no commission on cards. An approximate 5% is charged for credit card sales.
- All work must be original (or prints made from your own original) and for sale.
- TAKE-IN IS THE LAST TUESDAY OF THE MONTH from 9:30 am – Noon. (Holidays may change this date, so check the calendar on the cover of the Paint Rag.)
- Please have your take-in sheet and take-in tags (found in the Paint Rag) already filled out for take in day.
- Work must be framed unless you use wrap-around canvas stapled on the back (no staples on the sides).
   Frames must be attached professionally (check the guide-lines posted in the gallery or on the SDAG website). No bent-over nails or staples to hold the frame.
- The wires should be attached to wall art 1/4 to 1/5 of the way down from the top of the frame.
- You must have your name and the title of your piece on the reverse of your work.
- Do not bring wet paintings.
- You must have a multi-strand wire (please do not use the saw-toothed hangers that usually come with ready made frames) attached securely approximately ¼ of the way down from the top of frame and slack enough to come to approximately 2 inches from the top of the frame. Please tape the ends of the wire (loose wire ends can cut the hands of those doing the hanging).
- Be sure your work looks as nice as it can, well puttogether frame, clean well-cut mat.
- The Guild reserves the right to refuse entries that do not meet SDAG standards.
- Prints made from original art (such as Giclees) must clearly be identified as reproductions/prints (this includes those in the shrink wrap bin). California state law requires all reproductions to be numbered editions. Buyers deserve to know the number of copies available. Signed editions are generally thought of as more valuable to collectors. NOTE: Giclees are not included in the judging.
- Calligraphy as part of the art piece is acceptable.

#### Prints or Originals in Bins (SHRINK WRAP) SPECIFICATIONS

Each SDAG member may show 2 large and 5 small shrink—wrap pieces. There is no charge for showing shrink-wraps. Shrink-wraps have 10% commission on them. They must be enclosed in crystal clear envelopes with the artist name, the title and the price of the art piece clearly readable and in a place that it can be seen from the outside of the envelope. Full size shrink-wraps should not be any larger then the art bin. Small size shrink-wrap should be 9"x12" or smaller. All shrink-wraps should have a backing made from either 'backing board' or mat board, cut carefully to fit the size of the work. Total thickness of package must not exceed 1/4". Please: no ragged edges or thick backing or thick foam core since it takes up too much room in the bins. All shrink-wraps should be clearly marked: ORIGINAL OR PRINT.

#### **CARD RACK SPECIFICATIONS**

Every member can show cards and use 2 card slots if there is room on the rack. Artists do not pay commission on cards and there is no charge for displaying cards. All card requests must go through Barb Mille'.

## Torrey Pines as pretty as a picture to artists

TORREY PINES STATE BEACH

A s she perched on the edge of a bluff in the Torrey Pines reserve, Annette Lotuso Paquet applied a few deft strokes of a transparent glaze to the watercolor painting on her easel.

Her touch seemed to bring out the orange sandstone cliffs on her thick sheet of archival paper. A few more dabs with a darker shade thrust other rocks deeper into shadow as Paquet tried to capture the "greater reality" of the scene in front of her.

This state park is to Paquet what haystacks were to Claude Monet — a subject so rich with texture that it never grows old. After 30 years of painting at the reserve, Paquet still visits three mornings a week to explore its vistas and moods.

"You could stay just here, and in the facets that you see, you have a world to paint," she said while stepping back to ap-

praise her work.

Paquet isn't alone in her love for the reserve and the beach below. A dozen or so artists dotted the park on the recent morning she was there.

Their sun hats and measured movements contrasted with the grunts and fast pace of the hordes of runners and cyclists who also enjoy Torrey Pines, one of the county's most famous sites. Numerous perches

#### Reserve offers 'a natural scene,' one artist says

offer bird's-eye views of the majestic ocean, stark cliffs and wind-swept trees that allow visitors to glimpse coastal California as it was before urbanization.

"It offers a natural scene," said Joan Grine of Del Mar, who has painted at the reserve for three decades. "I like it peaceful."

"Plein air" — or open air painting in the Torrey Pines aren dates back more than 100 years and includes early notables such as Alfred Mitchell and Charles Fries.

By the 1970s, Japanese immigrant Tsuyoshi Matsumoto, known widely as Mat, had become a familiar figure at the reserve. He filled 30 sketchbooks with drawings of the park's namesake trees.

Today, the steady stream of artists is "one of the most charming and aesthetic aspects of the reserve," said Patricia Masters of the nonprofit Torrey Pines Association, a preservation group.

"I love to see those pallets with smears of color all over," she said. "I really suspect that when passers by see artists at work, their senses become

heightened. You are stimulated to try to see what the artist is seeing."

Artists spend hour after hour capturing the park's mystique in several mediums, including oil, pastels and watercolors. They haul their paints in bags along with water, extra clothes and scores of brushes and other tools.

Torrey Pines is prized partly because the interplay between sunlight and ocean mist, framed by the iconic trees, creates a kaleidoscope that changes almost by the minute.

"When the sun is here, like now, you see certain bushes. And when it moves, those bushes disappear and ... there is something else you see." Paquet said.

She dismisses any thought of

creating her artwork by looking at photographs in the comfort of her home-based studio on the Del Mar Mesa, where the walls are covered with her framed paintings of Torrey Pines. Some of them sell for \$2,000.

"You have got to be out there with it — live it, breathe it, become it and do it," Paquet said.

As Paquet packed up her gear to try another vantage point, Toni Williams of Solana Beach settled in near the adobe Visitor Center along with other members of the Plein Air Painters of San Diego who had chosen the reserve for their weekly "paint out" session.

Williams focused on one corner of the building that was dappled with sunlight and highlighted by an eye-popping clutch of bougainvillea.

"It's going, 'OK, come paint me,' "she said. "I think I caught it in the moment."

Williams enjoys depicting the same scenes as the great landscape artists in San Diego history.

Those guys painted here, and I'm here 100 years later and 100 years from now, someone else will be painting," she said.

For Williams, the reserve's allow is simple. "It's quintessential California," she said.

Plus, Torrey Pines is so popular with out-of-towners that it makes business sense to paint there. Thate to be absolutely blunt. Williams said, "but if



Today, the steady stream of artists is "one of the most charming and aesthetic aspects of the reserve," said Patricia Masters of the nonprofit Torrey Pines Association, a preservation group.

"I love to see those pallets with smears of color all over," she said. "I really suspect that when passers-by see artists at work, their senses become heightened. You are stimulated to try to see what the artist is seeing."

Artists spend hour after hour capturing the park's mystique in several mediums, including oil, pastels and watercolors. They haul their paints in bags along with water, extra clothes and scores of brushes and other tools.

Torrey Pines is prized partly because the interplay between sunlight and ocean mist, framed by the iconic trees, creates a kaleidoscope that changes almost by the minute.

"When the sun is here, like now, you see certain bushes. And when it moves, those bushes disappear and . . . there is something else you see," Paquet said.

She dismisses any thought of creating her artwork by looking at photographs in the comfort of her home-based studio on the Del Mar Mesa, where the walls are covered with her framed paintings of Torrey Pines. Some of them sell for \$2,000.

"You have got to be out there with it – live it, breathe it, become it and do it," Paquet said.

As Paquet packed up her gear to try another vantage point, Toni Williams of Solana Beach settled in near the adobe Visitor Center along with other members of the Plein Air Painters of San Diego who had chosen the reserve for their weekly "paint out" session.

Williams focused on one corner of the building that was dappled with sunlight and highlighted by an eye-popping clutch of bougainvillea.

"It's going, 'OK, come paint me,' " she said. "I think I caught it in the moment."

Williams enjoys depicting the same scenes as the great landscape artists in San Diego history.

"Those guys painted here, and I'm here 100 years later – and 100 years from now, someone else will be painting," she said.

For Williams, the reserve's allure is simple. "It's quintessential California," she said.

Plus, Torrey Pines is so popular with out-of-towners that it makes business sense to paint there. "I hate to be absolutely blunt," Williams said, "but if you were a tourist and loved the area . . . then perhaps you might like to purchase a piece of the local color."




