Responses to this question indicate that the vast majority (69.4%) of SDAG members have been in the organization less than 5 years. There is a drop-off in membership retention in the 5-10 year timeframe. This may be because: there has been a lot of growth in membership in that same timeframe and, members drop out of the Guild because they can no longer participate (moving out of the area, no longer able, change in job, etc.). If members stay 10 years, they are likely to stay even longer.

90% of SDAG members rate promoting art in the community of key importance. Of even greater importance, 96%, is supporting artists' efforts to exhibit and sell their work. The Mother's Day Studio and Garden Tour was ranked as important by 80% of respondents. Importance of environmental painters and quarterly art demonstrations were rated 48% and 70% respectively. Importance of networking and socializing was ranked at (79%). 66% of respondents indicated that Offsite shows were important. High rankings of gallery rental opportunities and monthly shows reinforces the importance of art sales as a Guild activity. ## 13. How would you like to see SDAG improve?

44 Response(s)

Comments to this question addressed appearance of the gallery itself and the manner in which art is displayed in the gallery. The comments were consistent with members' desire to enhance display opportunities and to improve art sales. Comments also fortified previous responses about enhancing the jurying and judging processes; including diversifying the kinds of art exhibited.

The 2nd and D spot is good, people are finally aware of our permanent location. But I think we should improve the quality of the art that we bring, limit the number of wall renters and number of floor renters / cards, etc so it doesn't look so over crowded and cluttered. Painting the gallery and cleaning the carpet would highly improve our look.

Increase community outreach, volunteer in the community, have members teach classes

It would be nice to have more space for wall art (yes I know I'm dreaming) so it's not so crowded--I would like to see the fine art (paintings) dominate and not the crafts, jewelry and phtography

change location of floor art, or display so not so busy and cluttered.

I like the quaint feel to OT1 but the cluttered, unprofessional

display's are not the best way to view art.

THE GALLERY IS MUCH TOO CROWDED. IT IS VERY HARD TO EVALUATE THE ART THAT IS DISPLAYED

I would like to see us be able to afford to make a few upgrades at the gallery in the back room and do something about the carpet (dirty & ugly.)

I would like for us to have full and lucrative monthly shows which get people motivated to enter.

The attitude of some of the people in charge of the gallery is wonderful...but the attitude of some is condesending and outright rude.

Perhaps get a better location with parking or more walk-by traffic if it can be done economically.

Higher quality art - even if it means less displayed. Actually less displayed would be better as it is way over crowded. Raised level of professionalism in the work and the presentation. SDAG gives me the feeling of a club of hobbyists, and that is fine if that is what everybody wants. I kind of don't want that.

I like the idea of art classes being taught I am assuming this would be to bring in revenue?

I think classes for children (small classes) would be a thought to get the community involved. Maybe during summer. Along with adult.

Also when sitters are at the gallery maybe a demo?

Get hooked up with ASID decorators and have them come and have appointments for hand selected people who are the most professional, to see their work and work with them.

BETTER LOCATION. MORE SPACE.

PERHAPS A REGULAR STAFF SKILLED IN PROMOTION AND SALES. A more professional staff who is trained to cater to the customer and SELL. This would mean training.

I think I would like to see a little more information for new members as far as gallery sitting, fees for wall rent, some sort of informational email or communication. When artists come in to check on their work or arrange displays they need to introduce themselves to the sitter, often times I don't know the artists when they come in.

The appearance of the gallery, looking in the windows from the outside needs improvement. It looks more like a thrift store than a fine art gallery. I think that a larger space and more visibility would nelp. See if we could have discounted classes at local art schools in exchange for Student art show at the gallery. Have members of the guild write articles on the arts, the arts community and the role of the artist in the community for local news papers and magazines.

OT (needs new floor, better lighting, better signage. Also, its hard for newer members to know what is going on because alot is assumed by older members, ie.information on events is vague. Sometimes the information wasn't complete as far as what is required and when to do events.

Wall rental space, especially that which is readily and easily visible to visitors should rotate in some way so that newer members have an opportunity to be seen

The window display should, in my opinion, be filled with artwork that is eye catching....something to draw interest.


It would be very helpful to know what is selling and to whom. While I don't make art for an outside audience, it doesn't hurt to know what people like to look at

Present for the meeting were Ricki, Judianne, Ella and Dave. The following items summarize the results of the meeting:

- 1. Initially the Gallery Committee (GC) will meet once a month on the second Tuesday of the month at 1pm. The next three meetings will be December 8, January 12, and February 9. The December meeting will be at St Tropez in the Lumberyard.
- 2. After a brief discussion about whether the jury committee and the GC should be the same we agreed that the jurying will occur at the beginning of the GC meeting if necessary. All of the members of the committee will jury in new renters.
- 3. The objective of the GC meeting will be to help to streamline the Board meeting by discussing the pros and cons of agenda items and making recommendations to the Board of any subjects as related to the gallery.
- 4. The Monthly Show room rework will include removing the unused door in the small monthly show room and patching the wall. In the large monthly show room the work will close in the opening between the space where the art is displayed and the computer area. When complete there will be a passage opening in the wall that lines up with the back door and the rest of the wall will blend in with the room. The work will be performed as follows:
  - a. On Tuesday November 17 Rita, Mo and Dave will deliver the materials necessary around closing time of the gallery.
  - b. On Wednesday morning Mo and Dave will frame the wall and hang the drywall.
  - c. Around noon Patricia will "mud" the walls. This process will take two days because of the time necessary for the compound to dry and the number of coats necessary. When the last coat of compound is on Dave will install the trim.
  - d. On Friday if the wall is ready Kathy will prime the walls and apply one coat of color paint.
  - e. If necessary another coat of color paint will be applied on Saturday.
- Dave took some time to update the committee on his meeting with the landlord. Essentially, Keith the landlord has agreed to perform many upgrades to the gallery if we sign a two year lease. Keith explained that he like us as tenants and does not want us to leave whether or not we sign a lease. The upgrades include removal of the carpeting, prepping and sealing the concrete, removal and texturing of the popcorn ceiling, patching and painting the walls, removal of the baseboards and extending the walls down to the floor without the use of baseboards, and removal of any unused wiring. Keith said this work would take two weeks and we would need a couple days to clear out the gallery and four or five days to get the gallery back together after the work is complete. This means the gallery will be closed for three weeks which will occur after the end of the Small Image Show in January, which is typically a slow month and the best time to close. If this work were to occur the entire gallery would need to be cleared out, Keith

- said he would help us to find a place to store our fixtures during the construction.
- 6. It was agreed to remove the print bins from the monthly show room. Dave will ask Judy Salinsky's mother Maria if she will allow us to store the bin in her garage until we decide what to do with it. Ella and Dave will temporarily lend the gallery one print rack each which will be placed in the front lobby. If they work and look good we will procure replacements.
- 7. Outdoor light in the gallery was discussed. It was generally agreed upon that the installation of "solar tubes" in the gallery would improve the appearance of the wall art by providing brighter natural light. Dave will continue to pursue this idea with the landlord and check to see if we might qualify for a rebate from the utility company for installation of solar tubes..
- 8. There is a short stub wall protruding down from the ceiling in the large monthly show room which appears to be left over from a wall removal. Dave will check with the landlord to see if this can be removed.
- 9. The two fluorescent lights in the large monthly show room will be removed at the time of the gallery upgrade.
- 10. A very lengthy discussion of the problems caused by the different ways that the two galleries were operated and its impact on the guild occurred. In general we all agreed that this was unhealthy and we should try to get both of the galleries operating under the same rules and under the same chairpersons. Dave will add an agenda item to the Board meeting to address this situation which states that for efficiency and consistency both galleries should operate under one wall chairperson, one floor chairperson and one gallery manager.
- 11. Dave will investigate the addition of signs places along Second Street and D Street similar to what the Christian Science Reading Room and Mother Lode Bookkeeping have to increase visibility from both directions along the streets..
- 12. In a tour of the gallery the following items were resolved:
  - The art frames to be installed in the gallery windows will be reduced in size from 30x40 to 24x30. This will allow them to be placed directly behind the "grid" in the windows. Four frames will be fabricated, two for each window in the lobby which will be located in the upper outer grid in each window. We discussed whether we should hang the BOS from the monthly show on the frames and finally agreed that we would keep one BOS for the current month only (will not have the BOS from the previous month on display anymore) and it would remain in the position that it was hung during the MS hanging. It would have a ribbon placed next to it. The use of the new frames will be resolved at a later date.
  - b. The space on the wall in the hallway where the BOS and small print rack currently reside will be used for the Soravias. Danny will be given this space at no charge and he will not have to

- staff the gallery for the space. That will free up his wall space for another renter.
- c. The Staffing desk will be expanded and reworked. A new desk will be investigated by Dave who will find a cabinet carpenter to give us a quote. On the front of the desk facing the lobby will be card displays. There will be a row of drawers on each side of the desk. The desk will be made to look like the white formica of the other displays in the lobby area.
- d. We will remove the small table in the hallway and use this area for card and /or print racks attached to the wall. The guest log will be relocated to the front desk and the artist bio book will be relocated to the front desk area where it will be placed on a shelf facing the hallway in the opening between the desk and the hall.
- e. For consistency the cubes will be removed and replaced by towers which match the existing. There will be five towers in front of the window along Second Street and six towers in front of the window along D Street. We will try to display the art so we look like a gallery and not like a jewelry store.
- f. The tower in the staffer's room will be relocated along the windows and this space will be used for a card rack. Additional card racks will be constructed on the hallway side below the opening between the staffer's desk and the hallway.
- g. Dave will try to find a way to display small prints on the door to the storage closet.
- Dave will see if the landlord will remove the small elevated window between the staffing room and AJ's studio. We would like the wall patched.
- 13. The meeting was adjourned. FINALLY!

Gallery Committee Meeting November 19, 2010

Attending the meeting were Ricki, Judianne, Rita, Ella and Dave

The purpose of the meeting was to develop a recommendation for presentation to the Board of Directors which would provide consistency, transparency and uniformity between the two galleries. The committee understands that with the end of the holiday season there may be a reduction in wall and floor renters in the Lumberyard location as artists anticipate fewer sales and think the gallery may be closing in January. We have spent considerable time and effort to address the issues that have existed since the creation of our second gallery and believe that with standardized policies these issues can be eliminated now and in the future. We believe it is necessary to be consistent, transparent and uniform between the galleries. Some issues that we addressed were:

- 1. Different rental rate structures.
- 2. Different staffing requirements.
- 3. Perception of one gallery being better than the other.
- 4. Inconsistency between the visibilities of rental spaces within gallery 2.
- 5. High artist turnover.
- 6. Quality control.

After extensive discussion and evaluation the committee recommends implementing the following policies effective January 1, 2010 (unless gallery 1 is closed for renovations, then effective February 1, 2010):

- 1. Artists will make a deposit equal to one month's rent for the space rented. This includes wall, floor and studio renters. Each artist will be required to give a 30 day written notice of intent to vacate their space. All rents will be paid at the time of rotation for the entire two month rotation period. Each chairperson will be responsible for maintaining the deposit records and notifying the treasurer of deposits both when the artist begins and terminates their rental. Deposits will be returned when the artist satisfies all of the rent payments and staffing obligations.
- 2. Gallery space will be rented at the same rates as recommended by the GC and approved by the board of directors. There will be no special deals for artists who receive more rental space for less rent.
- 3. Artists will be required to staff the same amount for the same rental space between both galleries. All artists will comply with the staffing rules as

set down by the gallery committee and approved by the board of directors.

- 4. Artists will be juried in by the jury committee which will meet monthly to review the prospective renters. Artists will be required to bring representative samples of their artwork on the jury day and return later in the day to pick up their work. The jury committee will notify the artists of the results in a reasonable amount of time. The members of the jury committee will include the gallery committee and at least two member artists. Member artists may be rotated based upon availability.
- 5. The GC understands that there are many positive and negative aspects regarding inter gallery rotations. They do recommend that all wall and floor renters will be required to rotate throughout both galleries to provide equal opportunity to all gallery renters. If this idea is approved by the board the GC will develop a rotation plan. After the inter gallery rotation begins and the second gallery closes the existing gallery rental space will go to the highest seniority renters. The GC will also develop a policy to handle artists who rent in both galleries.
- 6. The receptions should rotate between the two galleries.

Two remaining inconsistencies between the galleries that will be need to be resolved are how to handle the different hours of operation as it relates to hours staffed by the renters and the commission charged by the gallery. The GC believes that these two areas will require further analysis and discussion before a recommendation can be made.

## 2. New Business

- a. Soravia Prints. Discussion: Ricci, will he still represent originals? Bruce: yes. Mary, prints could attract attention to originals. Laura: Nothing is lost by approval since no \$ is invested by the guild.. Isabella: Motion to approve Soravia print proposal as written (see attached) with the ammendment of a limit of 25 prints on canvas and 100 on paper. Second Grace. Vote: 14 for approval.
- b. Survey results and Summary by Deborah. A review of the process of the survey, which was done to help with strategic planning, as well as a summary and analysis is included on the attached printed copy. Some notable input:
- Selling artwork is the primary reason for most guild memberships.
- Members are positive about the opportunities the guild offers.
- #6. There is not a clear consensus on the location and facility of OT1, the results could be a reinforcement for moving to a new location or for fixing up current location.
- Promoting and selling work and promoting work in the community are important to the members.
- Benefits rated by members reinforce the variety of opportunities offered are effective in meeting the needs of the membership.
- Jury process for wall renters could improve. Isabella: Feedback from jury is important. Laura: There should be a clear distinction between wall and monthly renters with clarity about monthly being the opportunity for new "emerging" artists. Bruce: In general we need to have a balance of commitment to promote new artists and to the quality of artwork exhibited.
- Survey will be put online for membership to review.

- Bruce, strategic planning using the survey will be dealt with at a later time.
- c. Foreseeable future of OT2, discussion led by Bruce.
- History of OT2: Bruce and Terri presented contract ideas to realtor for Lumberyard and with Board approval. opened the gallery as complement to OT1. There has been a benefit of direction public to OT1 from OT2.
- Problems: Consistency issues between galleries. Increased workload for most board members.
- Positives: Location, appearance and extra space for showing is a benefit to members as well as making money for members. Grace: Morale at OT2 is better because of location.
- Issues: % on artwork discrepancy (20% at OT2 and 10% at OT1) Accounting at OT2 is not clear to members, the 20% goes to rent. Diane: Inconsistency in volunteerism from people showing at OT2 and OT1. At 2 they are not asked or expected to do other guild work. Bruce: Objections have been voiced about Terrie's demeanor in addressing staffers. Ricci: OT2 is beginning to look like a jewelry store not a gallery. (not sure who said this) Wall renters should rotate because the gallery looks stale.
- Recommendations: Joanne: To address the % discrepancy, make it 20% overall and drop the credit card 5.4% charge. It would make bookkeeping easier. need to look at overall financial policies. Judianne: To make OT2 look more like a gallery have more diversity in the front window. Isabella: Consider professional signs to describe watercolor, painting and so on.
- Observations: Grace: Paintings are selling better at OT! and "other" better at OT2. Judianne: Painting and photos: OT1 \$11,114 and \$6,873 at OT2. Photos only: OT1 \$554 and OT2 \$977. jewelry: OT2 \$10,237 and OT1 \$2,304. Overall sales at OT2 were higher. Comparison is based on sales since OT2 opened.
- d. Gallery committee report, by Dave.
- Issues and recommendations are in hand-out (see attached). Grace: Maybe open up OT2 to more floor renting. Judianne: May have more space, need to juggle 1 and 2 renters who keep 1 to stay if 2 closes. Ricci: People may drop at the first of the year.
- Motion: Isabella: move to accept recommendations as written. second Deborah. Vote. yes 13
- Dave: Gallery upgrades. In general need to determine what we want to sell, 2D or 3D. Strategic plan should be carefully thought out. Could use a 2 year lease (see attached proposal) window to plan. To do the work on the gallery it would close for January and the landlord would do the work the cost is the 2 year lease.



Congratulations to Chuck McPherson, A. J. Dieffenbach and Cheryl Ehlers all sold high-end paintings in November at Off Track Gallery 1. Congratulations to all our member artists for achieving terrific sales in 2009.

One of your pieces may be placed in the portable bins that are placed outside the front door each day. All bin art must be original or limited edition prints.

Bin art should have a backing made from either backing board or mat board cut carefully to fit the size of the work. Total thickness of the package must not exceed 1/4". Please -- no ragged edges or thick backing or foam core because it takes up too much room in the bins.

The pieces must be enclosed in crystal clear envelopes with artist's name, title and price of clearly readable and in a place that can be seen from the outside of the envelope. All art in shrink wrap must be clearly marked Original or Print. Each piece of bin art must be listed in the Bin Art Directory under the artist's name with the title, price and date placed in the bin.

At Off Track 1, 10% commission is charged on sales of shrink-wrap pieces. At Off Track 2, commission is 20% on shrink-wrap pieces. There are no other charges.

# **Artist Outreach Grant**

The Kenneth A. Picerne Foundation will begin accepting Artist Outreach Project Grant applications beginning January 4, 2010. This grant supports accomplished visual, literary and performing artists, 55 years of age or older, who are motivated to give back to their community. The Foundation will award twenty artists \$12,000 to provide educational, mentoring or therapeutic art experiences of their own design to underserved people who lack opportunities to engage in meaningful arts programs.

To be eligible, artists must be 55 years of age or older and live in North San Diego County or Orange County. The application deadline is March 30, 2010. Artists are asked to collaborate with nonprofit organizations of their choice in order to access the people they wish to serve. The Foundation expects artists awarded the grant will provide an average of six to eight direct contact hours a week for one year.

# Behind the Corner Frame Shop

For the

amazing stretch of 18 and a half years - from March 1975 to September 1993 - SDAG had a "permanent" home.

Next time you drive by the Corner Frame Shop at 1038 North Highway 101 in Leucadia stop and take a look at the building directly behind (to the West). That is where the Guild was housed. I am told that the building was "like a rabbit's warren" — it just kept going and going. In the large parking area the Guild held many Starving Artist Sales, Art Marts, Paint-outs and Rummage Sales.

Membership was on average 115 to 120 during those years. During this time, San Dieguito Art Guild was a separate entity from the Offtrack [one word] Gallery which was downstairs in the Pannikin old train station building. The two groups merged in September of 1994 when Patricia Watkins was president.

# Attention Artists:

The Next Gallery Renters Jurying Date is December 8, 2009

You may have been wondering how you would go about getting your art displayed on the walls and floor of our galleries. Possibly what you didn't know was that we have a jury which reviews prospective gallery renters.

Our galleries are divided into sections which are rented on a monthly basis to our members. Gallery space rent is paid bimonthly and a deposit is collected from the renters when they sign the contract. But before you can rent gallery space you must be juried in by our jury committee.

The jury committee meets once a month to review the artwork of prospective gallery renters. The next jury committee meeting date is **December 8, 2009, 11am - 3pm**. If you would like to be a wall renter or a floor renter you must be juried in by the Jury Committee.

I will briefly explain the process:

- You bring a representative sample of your artwork to the location specified between the hours of 11am and 11:30am. Late artists will not be eligible for this jury cycle and will have to wait until the next cycle.
- Leave your work for the jury committee to review and evaluate.
- Return to pick up your artwork between 3pm and 3:30pm.
- The jury committee will notify you once they have reached a decision.

The location of the jury committee meeting as well as answers to any questions that I receive as a result of this announcement will be communicated by eblast and will also be posted in the galleries. The next two scheduled jury committee meetings after December 8, 2009 will be January 12, 2010 and February 9, 2010.

- Ricki proposed a bin schematic similar to card racks. Call Artists when work will be removed.
- Cindy suggested that shrink wraps have colored dots on the back that will coordinate with corresponding bins. Each bin will then have a list of Artists that belong in each bin. For example: Jane is working at the Gallery, she has a shrink wrap with a blue dot on the back, and she puts it away in the blue dot bin. Example 2: Customer looking for a shrink by a certain

artist, the staff worker only needs to look at the bin lists to help the customer.

- Action Item Dave will take suggestions to Doreen for organizing bins and will let Board know of her thoughts/opinions at the Jan. meeting.

  Other:
- Large shrink wraps Dave said that we could have shrink wraps on floor.

# F. Lighting:

Discussion about lighting. Gallery Manager Dave O. sought comments and input.

- Laura asked if the popcorn ceilings will be removed. Dave Answer:yes.
- Laura said that perhaps we could partner with Keith to get track lighting. Dave said he would ask, but we need to remember that we are trying to save money.
- Grace said that she thinks the current lighting is fine.
- Bruce commented that we need to think about more wattage.
- Dave said that we should agree on a set number of lights per space/wall. Dave recommended 2 per space.
- In terms of Costs Joanne asked what is Keith's financial responsibility to the project? Has he agreed to any dollar amount?
  - G. Handicap accessibility:
- Bruce asked about handicap accessibility to the Gallery.
- Laura said that Keith did mention that this could be a potential issue and that is why the Guild decided only to go month to month.

# H. Fixtures and towers

- Do we want to use the displays that we have or purchase new fixtures?
- The cost of new fixtures is \$100 to 200 per tower.
- Ricki commented that towers restrict Artists, while they are good for jewelry, they do not work for floor art such as Teri's and Grace's work.
- It was concluded that this is a Gallery committee issue

## 4. Rotation Schedule:

Summary of issue:

Inequality exists between the 2 galleries because there is no rotation between the two. We need to work towards a plan that would make it fair between the 2 galleries. In order to be fair to all artists there needs to develop a system. The Gallery committee held several meetings and came up with a rotation plan.

- Dave Ombrello presented a document detailing the rotation plan and explained how the system would work. SEE Attachment (hard copy only)
- Artist would sign up for 4 months at a time
- Rotations would be between the 2 galleries
- Rotations would occur over a 4 day period. Discussion by Board Members after review of the proposed rotation document:
- Grace asked what if Gallery 2 closes.
- Terri's is concerned with the rotation schedule because she thinks it will cause Artists to leave OTG2.
- Judianne said that there should not be a cause for concern.
- A discussion of a one day rotation schedule was discussed. Joanne Chambers said that one day rotations have been done in the past when SDAG was at the Pannikin, it was hectic, but it worked.
- Patricia wondered Artists want to sign up for 4 months
- Ricki said that Rita Cecil will not like 4 day rotation.
- Deborah Van Huiss commented that she likes that it combines 2 galleries and shows that we are unified.
- Ellablanche said that some people will only want to be in OTG2 and not want to be rotated into OTG1.
- Bruce said that part of being a SDAG member is supporting both Galleries.
- Ricki added to the discussion that there is a lot of blank wall space in OTG1. She asked what should be doing to with blank walls?
- Dave asked: Is the inter gallery rotation something that the Gallery Committee should pursue?

Vote: Favor of a wall rotation walls between the 2 galleries, 6 yes.2 no 5 abstain

#### Discussion of Commissions:

- Dianne Dudek wanted to change the commission collection back to the way it was when SDAG was at the Pannikin, where the monthly renters pay the commission.
- Laura Lowenstein said in the past when we eliminated commission, a member then had to do volunteer job.
- Bruce said that commissions are paid to cover the rent.
- Another reason for high commission rate at

OTG2: Joanne reminded Board Members of our rental agreement at OTG2. We pay estimated triple net and then we can expect to get a bill, for things like paving, lighting. This bill could be as much as \$5,000.00. For this reason, the commissions are also higher at OTG2.

- Deborah VH requested that if commission structure was to be changed, a more detailed proposal would be needed to be presented to and reviewed by the Board prior to any changes taking place.
- o The Board would need to know the financial impact of changes to commission structure. Change to commissions will effect bottom line.

- Gallery Committee will prepare a proposal and present for a vote.
- Motion Dave makes a motion to vote to endorse the recommendations of the Gallery committee's to Inter-Gallery rotation and vote on any changes to commission be voted on after a presentation at a later date. Judianne seconds the motion. Vote results: 8 yes, 3abstain 1 no, passes by a majority.



A North County tradition is set to continue on New Year's Day with a Leucadia artist who has kicked off the last several years by creating a flashy and interactive labyrinth in the sand at Grandview Beach.

Kirk Van Allyn, known better in art circles as Kirkos, builds his elaborate designs with a box of tools, including a hockey stick, a casting pole and some he made himself. This year, he also plans to use 150 pounds of colored sand to give the labyrinth some color, he said.

The artist said he will start the design by noon Friday, finishing up by sunset. People will be able to walk on the meditative labyrinth, which will be about 120 feet from end to end.

"A person can walk hand-in-hand with their lover through the whole labyrinth," he said.

The center of the labyrinth will feature a convex plastic mirror that will give those walking near it a look at the sky and the people around them.

Those wishing to participate in the project can bring biodegradable decorations such as flowers, colored stones and course salt.

The Leucadia resident uses ancient shapes and patterns to create designs in the sand that he calls "sacred geometry." By focusing on geometric patterns and mathematics, he's able to turn simple shapes into something more intricate and interesting.

The tide usually washes away his hard work after a couple of hours, but Van Allyn is able to preserve the art through photographs.

He has been creating labyrinths at local beaches on New Year's Day for the last six years, though he has been drawing in the sand for more than a decade.

"It just all evolved," he said.

Van Allyn is dedicating the work this year to the San Dieguito Art Guild, a group of roughly 100 local artists. He has been a member of the 43-year-old nonprofit group for the last decade. The guild will help out by supplying some decorative materials for the labyrinth.

Grandview Beach is about a mile south of Ponto State Beach, just off Grandview Street in Encinitas. Van Allyn said it will be easiest to find parking at Ponto Beach.

Van Allyn said he hopes the labyrinth will help bring the community and families closer together.

"How often do you get excited about drawing a line in the sand?" He said. "Little kids see it and they just jump up and down."
